LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

First settled in 1695, Lebanon is a rural, historic town located in Southeastern Connecticut. Lebanon is one of the largest towns in the state by area. The population is approximately 7,000. The Regional Agricultural Science Program and the traditional education program serve thirteen (13) surrounding communities.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A Lyman Memorial High School diploma is awarded to students who have earned at least twenty-five (25) credits and met the following requirements:

4 credits English
3 credits Social Studies
(including 1 credit of U.S. History and 0.5 in Civics)
4 credits Math (including Algebra 1 and Geometry)
3 credits Science (including Biology)
1 credit Physical Education
0.5 credits Health
2 credits World Language
0.5 credits Senior Project
2 credits Fine Arts/Business/Technology or Vocational Education
5 credits Electives

*Students have the opportunity to earn high school credit for Algebra 1, French 1 and Spanish 1 at Lebanon Middle School & through other articulated agreements.

CURRICULUM: Traditional Program

The curricula of English, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies is enriched with a World Language Program (French and Spanish), Agriculture, Art, Music, Physical Education, Health and Technology (Applied Business, Family & Consumer Sciences) programs.
