Definition

The definition of homeless children and youth are those who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. Under the larger umbrella of lacking a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, the law also provides several examples of situations that meet the definition. The examples include children and youths:

- sharing housing due to a loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason;
- living in hotels, motels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to a lack of alternative adequate housing;
- living in emergency or transitional shelters;
- abandoned in hospitals;
- living in a public or private place not designated for, or normally used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;
- living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar places;

What are the requirements of the school?

- To Provide an education to homeless students
- To Provide Transportation To and From School
- To Enroll Students Immediately
- To make sure students receive the same programs as other students
- To make sure students receive free school meals
- To remove all barriers.

How Can I Help?

- All Staff are charged with:
 - Supporting homeless students and their families
 - Providing a welcoming climate & build trust for homeless students
 - Identification and supporting homeless students
 - Being sensitive & understanding to the needs of homeless students
