
One fun fact about Minecraft is that it was almost called Cave Game.

was first It passed as a law on June 23, 1972. On August 14, 2020, Title IX was updated, allowing no one to discriminate or harass another person, based on gender. This includes unfair treatment, attitudes, or behaviors towards an individual that is based upon that person's gender.

the Title IX team includes Mrs. Faller, who is the coordinator, Mr. Allard, who is the investigator, Ms. Bieber, the decision maker, and a board member, assigned by the school board, for the decision maker appeal.

If anyone reports an incident, the Title IX investigator looks into the allegation, and deals with the incident in accordance with the law, and in a manner they think is reasonable. If there is a false allegation, it is the accuser who faces

punishment, rather than the accused.

Title IX has recently gained a good deal of attention from educators. According to Assistant Principal Allard, North in Dakota, one of the leading reason for lawsuits with schools is sexual harassment.

Grandma Moses' art usually depicted her memory of rural, country life. Recipe: McCall's Best Angel-Food Cake

Ingredients:

Directions:

12-14 Egg Whites

In Large bowl, let egg whites warm to room temperature.

1-1/4 c. sifted* Cake Flour

2. Meanwhile, preheat the oven to 375F.

1-3/4 cups sugar

3. Sift flour with 3/4 cup sugar; resift 3 times; set aside.

1/2 tsp. Salt

4. With a portable electric mixer, at high speed, beat egg whites with salt and cream of tartar until soft peaks form until stiff peaks form when the beater is slowly raised.

1-1/2 tsp. Cream of Tartar I tsp. Vanilla Extract

5. Gradually beat in remaining sugar, 1/4 cup at a time, beating well after each addition. Continue beating until stiff peaks from when the beater is

1/2 tsp. Almond Extract * Sift Before Measuring


6. With a rubber scraper, gently fold extracts into egg whites until combined.

(taken from McCall's Cook Book, 1917)

7. Sift flour mixture, ¼ at a time, over egg whites. With rubber scraper, using an under-and-over motion, gently fold in each addition with 15strokes, rotating the bowl a quarter after each addition.

- 8. Then fold an additional 10 strokes; flour mixture should be blended into egg whites.
- 9. With a rubber scraper, gently push batter into an ungreased 10-inch tube pan. With a spatula or knife, cut through the batter twice.
- 10. With a rubber scraper, gently spread batter in the pan until it is smooth on top and touches the side of the pan.
- 11. Bake, on a lower oven rack, 35-40 minute, or until the cake springs back when gently pressed.
- 12. Invert pan over neck of bottle; let cake cool completely- about 2 hours.
- 13. With spatula, carefully loosen cake from pan; remove. Serve plain or as desired
