

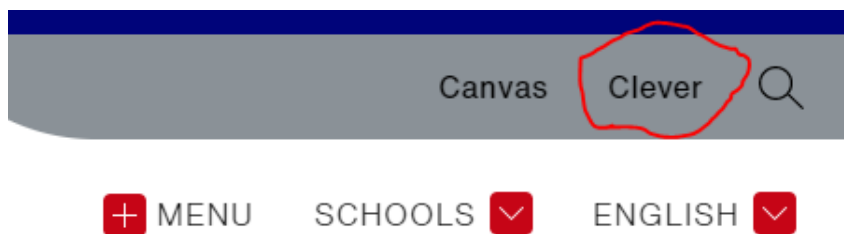
Accessing the Star Renaissance Assessment for Students

There are a couple of important things to note:

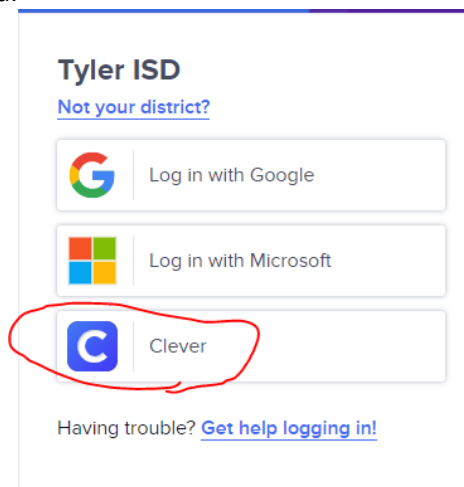
- This is a computer adaptive test that increases the difficulty of questions as students get questions correct and decreases the difficulty as students get questions incorrect. Any additional assistance provided to students during the assessment will impact their score and could provide misleading information about the student's current performance level to the teacher.
- Questions are timed with anywhere from 45 seconds to 3 minutes per question, depending on the subject, question, and grade level. A flashing clock will appear in the middle of the student's name at the top of the test when there are 15 seconds left prior to moving to the next question.

DIRECTIONS

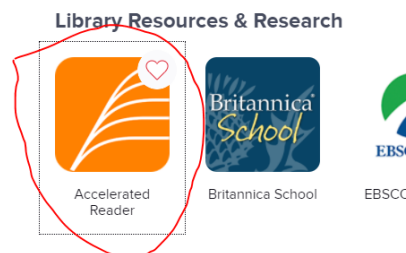
1. Log into CLEVER through your student's campus website. There will be a CLEVER link available in the top-right corner of the page.



2. After clicking CLEVER, choose the CLEVER option and login using student's ID# (or lunch #) as the username and birthday (MMDDYY) as the password.



3. After logging in, click on the "Accelerated Reader" icon under the "Library Resources & Research" section.

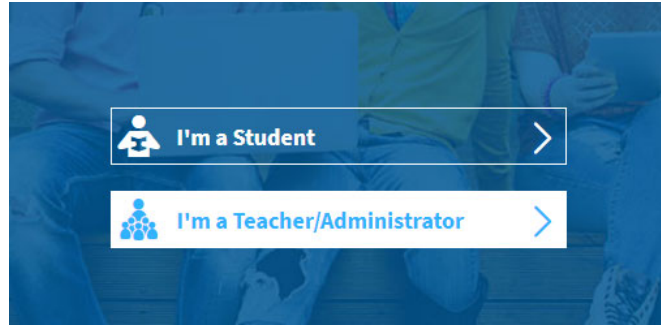


4. If a pop-up window opens asking you to update your login or CLEVER extension, simply select "Go to Accelerated Reader."

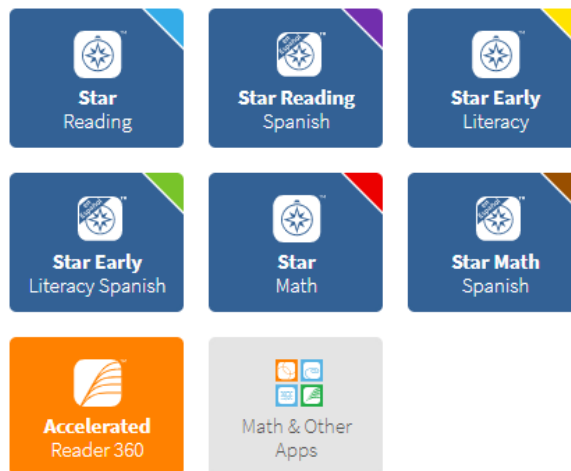

5. That will redirect to the Renaissance website. Select “I’m a Student” and login using the same information (lunch # as username and birthday as the password).



6. Select the appropriate assessment according to the student’s grade. Each student must take an Early Literacy/Reading and math test.

- **Kindergarten – 1st Grade:**
 - Star Early Literacy or Star Early Literacy Spanish
 - Star Math or Star Math Spanish
- **2nd – 8th Grade:**
 - Star Reading or Star Reading Spanish
 - Star Math, or Star Math Spanish



7. Each assessment will begin with three practice questions that the student must complete to move forward with the test. As long as the student answers them correctly, it will assign them to the 34-question test. If a student answers the three practice questions incorrectly, the student will be forced to login and attempt the practice questions again.
8. After a student completes the full assessment, it will log the student out of the assessment without showing any score. The student can then login and complete the other assessment (either Reading or Math). Teachers will review and go over data with each student.
