## WCC STUDENTS

A reminder that students who attend WCC are required to wear a mask on their campus at all times and must be worn over both the mouth and nose. If they receive a referral, they will have one warning issued. A second referral will result in removal from the WCC program. Please respect their requirements and wear your mask correctly.

The WCC day-time health science program will be back starting next week for those students previously enrolled who would still like to participate. **In addition, they will offer an evening CNA program option for students who were previously enrolled in the health sciences program and would not be interested in returning for the daytime program.** The program will be offered free of charge for previously enrolled students. Classes will run from September 29, 2020–February 2, 2021 at the Waynesville Career Center. Classes will be held two nights per week on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 5:00-8:00 pm. Students must complete a minimum of 91 hours of instruction and cannot miss more than 4 classes. There will be four make-up classes offered on February 4, 9, 11, & 16.

## RICHLAND ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (RAP)

The Richland Assistance Program will begin next week, Tuesday, September 15th, and will be held each week on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings from 7:10am-7:50am in the library. RAP is also available in the afternoon from 3:30pm-4:10pm in Mrs. Evans' classroom in the junior high wing. If you would like extra assistance with your classwork, please feel free to stop by. There is no need to sign-up, just show up.

Virtual RAP - we are currently working on creating Virtual RAP sessions for those students learning from home. Virtual RAP will occur at the same time and days as regular RAP sessions. As soon as it is ready, we will post it.

## VIRTUAL STUDENTS

A reminder that tomorrow, Friday, is the last day of the two week grace period to decide if you will remain in virtual school or return to the seated classroom. If you choose to remain virtual, you may return to school the first day after the first quarter ends which is Monday, October 26th. Those who remain virtual after the 26th may not return to the seated classroom until the first day of third quarter, Monday, January 5th.

## SEAMLESS SUMMER OPTION EXTENSION

Beginning tomorrow, September 4th, and until further notice, all junior high and high school students will have free breakfast and lunch. This will not change things for the students in the



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elementary , as they were already eating free. This program is scheduled to last through December, or until funding runs out - whichever comes SOONER. This change will not eliminate any previous outstanding balances due by students. Those balances will still need to be paid.

## LOCKERS


Now that school is underway, students have a better understanding of the safety measures we are trying to implement and how different the school day is from the 'normal'. The next step is to assign lockers. Over the next couple/few days, we will be assigning lockers to students, beginning today with the junior high. One of the recommendations of the CDC is that students do not share school supplies, including lockers. Because of that, we ask you to remind your child not to share their locker with anyone. The school does not issue locks for lockers so please bring a lock to keep your items safe.

## HEADPHONES FOR JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Over the next couple of weeks, our students will be taking state approved achievement tests that will help us recognize where gaps in learning occurred due to last spring's school closing.



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The English portion contains listening items in which students will need headphones. Although we have some at the school, we would like to encourage students to bring their own headphones to school this Thursday, September 3rd and Friday, September 4th. This will help ensure that not only will we have enough for testing, it will reduce the amount of headphone sharing between students. If the sharing of school headphones is necessary, those will be cleaned and sanitized for the next use.

## WCC Students

## LAUNCH STUDENTS

Also, please ensure families that all Launch teachers have been communicated with and are being super flexible. **Students will not be penalized!** If you have specific questions regarding elementary teachers: Please communicate that all K-5 teachers have now been placed, and all students will be hearing from their teachers with activities to complete this coming Monday, August 31.*

## STUDENT DRIVERS





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As a reminder, students parking on campus is a privilege, not a right. Student drivers are expected to drive with courtesy and respect. There are a lot of different things going on during arrival and dismissal times. Student drivers are expected to yield to busses and they pull in and exit the school. It is important that students yield to busses as they make wide turns which can cause safety concerns. Please focus on safety while driving on campus.

## GRAB-N-GO BREAKFAST CART

A Grab-n-Go Breakfast Cart is now available in the mornings starting at 7:40am. Students now have the option of a hot breakfast with two options to choose from or the Grab-n-Go Cart which has a variety of options in which they can take to the gym.

## CAR RIDER PICK-UP

All car riders will be picked up at the junior high school doors. Students are released from the gym as cars pull forward. Students will not be sent out of the gym to meet elsewhere.

## TECHNOLOGY AGREEMENT

All students must have a technology agreement on file in order to use district computers and student emails. Please get this agreement signed and returned as soon as possible. Technology access will be turned off beginning September 8th for those who do not have an agreement on file.

## WCC STUDENTS

As long as WCC remains virtual, all Richland WCC students needing a place to login to their school may come to the high school library to connect with their classes. Please arrive by 8:45



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to give yourself plenty of time to get settled in. You may stay in the library until the end of the regular school day, 3:18pm, to work on classwork, homework, etc. if you need to.

FROM WCC UPDATE ON 8/25

Please read the following information per a WCC update. Thank you.

- All students will need to be online for the entire two hours with their teachers, they may be doing independent work but will be supervised by their instructor. If you are at your school doing independent work they will need your cameras on.
- You will get one 15 minute break or two small breaks within the two hours.
- Attendance will not count against you for the first few days, but try and login as soon as possible.
- If you need someone to walk you through how to get login, have them call the WCC office and someone will help them.
- If you are logged into Google through your home school email it will not let you into Canvas. You will have to log out and re-login under your WCC Google account to get access to email and Canvas.


## WATER BOTTLES

Students are encouraged to bring water bottles to school. However, they must be clear/see-through and no open container may be brought in the building (ex. Casey's drinks, coffee cups, etc.). Please finish these types of drinks before entering school.

## MASK UPDATE

Because our busses cannot be adequately socially distanced, students will have to wear a mask when riding a bus. Students will also have to wear a mask coming and going from the high school as well as in the common areas of the school (hallways, bathrooms, cafeteria (until seated to eat), and anywhere else we cannot completely socially distance.

## VISITORS

We are trying to cut down on individuals in the building to the bare minimum and ask that visitors wear masks while on campus. If you need to drop off something for your student or to get them a message, please contact the high school office and we will be more than happy to help accommodate you.

## TEMPERATURES AND FEVERS



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As a great safety measure and a huge help in keeping everyone at the school safe, please take a quick temperature reading of your child before sending them to school. If there is a reading of 100.4 or higher (and/or other symptoms are present), please keep them home. This is a vital move that can keep everyone as safe as possible.

Hello,

I cannot believe that we are six days away from coming back to school and actually being in the building. It has been a long time and I am really looking forward to seeing everyone again.

I have included some back-to-school information and some of the changes we are making this year in order to be as safe as possible. Please keep in mind that this is an on-going process and information is subject to change.


## OPEN HOUSE

Open House will take place on Thursday, August 20 from 4:30-7:30pm. At this time, we are asking all 7th grade students, freshman and seniors to plan to visit between 4:30-5:30, 8th grade students and sophomores between 5:30-6:30, and juniors between 6:30-7:30. The Junior High and High School will be open throughout the evening, but masks are strongly recommended and we ask that no more than two people per student visit their teachers. While waiting to speak to a teacher, please practice safe social distancing in the hallways as much as possible.

If you do not feel comfortable coming to the building for Open House, each teacher will have a virtual Open House video or slideshow for you to view on their Google Classroom site. ## LOCKERS/BACKPACKS

In order to work with social distancing guidelines and increase the efficiency of movement in the hallways, students will not be issued lockers this year. Instead, students will need to carry



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all school supplies in their backpacks throughout the day. Students who have locker needs will be handled on a case-by-case basis and approval by the Principal.

## MASKS

In an effort to be as safe as possible, we strongly recommend students wear masks throughout the school day. Teachers will be required to wear masks in all common areas of the school. We request and encourage all visitors to the building to also wear masks.

## CLASSROOM SOCIAL DISTANCING

Each teacher will organize their classroom to comply with the 6 foot social distancing recommendation as best as possible. In cases where that is not feasible, students will be asked to wear masks. We hope to have a spot in each classroom for students to go to to have a mask break if needed.

## FREE DUAL CREDIT: MSU AND CMU

Qualifying students have the opportunity to earn 6 hours of college credit for free through Missouri State University or Central Methodist University. This does apply to students who take dual credit here at Richland. It is not "in addition to" the regular school caseload.
