Math News from Mr. Cassidy



1st Quarter in Social Studies with Team Moosehead

Students have been actively involved in reviewing map-globe skills in the recent weeks. We have completed Chapter 1 Core Concepts to prepare us for our explorations into Ancient Civilizations.

Our first civilization is Ancient Egypt. In this unit we will look at the geography and how it impacted the Egyptians both positively and negatively. We will also learn how it helped Egypt to prosper and

become very powerful. Students will learn the vocabulary, the social classes, their beliefs in religion, the afterlife and what daily life was like in Ancient Egypt.

Next steps include deeper looks into mummification, how bodies and tombs were prepared for the afterlife, King Tut and hieroglyphics, just to name a few.

SCIENCE- Miss Macomber

Our year in science class has been off to a great start. We will be learning how to make detailed scientific observations and how to use those observations to support our inferences, claims, and opinions. We are also learning how to formulate claims and explanations that are scientific by including evidence from our observations and scientific resources.

We have gotten a slow start to get into content this year because there were so many more "miscellaneous items" that needed to be covered to prepare the students for remote learning. So far, we have learned about the new policies and procedures around school, how attendance works when students are at home, how to log into PowerSchool to take grades, how to check out a book virtually from the library, and how Google Classroom works including Google Docs and Google Forms. If you have any questions about any of those topics, just send me an email, and I'd be happy to go over them with you!

Graded student work is given back to students a pick-up system in a filing cabinet in the classroom. If you are curious to see your student's work, please ask them to pick it up one day during Falcon Time and bring that home to you. If you are only interested in viewing your students grades, grades are typically entered into Powerschool within a few days of being passed in (and never longer than 2 weeks after the due date).
