# Free Meals Program Extended

Free to-go meals (lunch and breakfast) for children aged 1-18 are available at each elementary school Monday through Friday, 11:00 am - 12:30 pm and through bus routes in areas not close to the schools.

Circumstances have changed for many families, therefore, you may aualify now whereas you might not have in the past. Only one form is necessary for each family.

Additionally, completed applications for aualified families help to provide critical funding for academic and social-emotional services for students through the Learning Assistance Program and Title 1 assistance at schools across the district.

# MARSHALL SPECIALISTS HUB

#### 1. How to Find the Hub

Sign in to the Chromebook, and click the Google Classroom icon in the Clever student portal.

#### 2. ONCE IN GOOGLE CLASSROOM

At the top of the google classroom page click on "Classwork". On the side of the classwork tab you will see a Specialists topic. When you click on that topic it will open and you will find the above picture. Click on it.

#### 3. SLIDES WILL OPEN

Once slides open you will need to click the button in the top right corner of the page that says "present". Once you are in present mode click on the specialists your student has that day.

#### 4. SECOND SPECIALIST PAGE WILL OPEN

Once you get to your specialist's page you will find two links in all of them. If you are joining the live zoom meeting you will click the "live zoom" button. If you were not able to make it to the meeting you can click the "past meetings" button.

Some teachers may have taught kids a different way to get to the specialists hub, but if you are not sure please check with your teacher. We hope to see your student in each of our wonderful specialists' classrooms. They are excited to be connecting with your students each and every day.

# HOME WI-FI NETWORK TIPS

### Tip #1: Place your Wi-Fi router in a central unobstructed location in your home.

This gives you a stronger signal and better speeds.



#### Tip #2: Remove things near your router that may obstruct the Wi-Fi signal.

Objects can interfere with your Wi-Fi connectivity. Move items away from your router. Microwaves, baby monitors, and metal are especially bad for network signals.

### Tip #3: Limit your family's network usage while Zooming.

Fewer people concurrently using your home Wi-Fi network can help improve network performance. If multiple family members are video conferencing at the same time, this can affect performance.

#### Tip #4: Check your download and upload speeds.

Many ISPs offer very fast \*download\* speeds, but slower \*upload\* speeds. Video conferencing, which uses upload AND download functions continuously, may lag or drop during heavy network usage. You can check your current download and upload speeds using various online tools (search for "speed test"). For gallery view and/or 720p HD video, Zoom recommends at least 1.5Mbps/1.5Mbps (up/down).

### Tip #5: Check your modem.

Check with your internet service provider to make sure that the modem you have supports the speeds you've signed up for.

# **K-12 Internet Access Program**

The Washington Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction has recently informed us that there is a new program where students whose families are low-income and are not currently connected to the internet can get connected through the end of the 2020-21 school year for free.
