

JCSD-NECC Covid-19 Statement:

As we all know, COVID is in our community and in our school. Currently, there are 18 people (students and staff) who are positive. Contact tracing is mostly complete and all identifiable close contacts have been notified to quarantine.

At this time we will not pivot to virtual education districtwide. School plays a vital role in the development of children, and JCSD will remain open to onsite instruction to any student who is not otherwise quarantined. Regular bus routes will continue, but at times we may have early releases for certain bus routes so that we have enough drivers. We will announce changes in bus service as soon as we know them, but currently there are no alterations in bus service.

The district asks parents to consider the virtual option. If you have internet or cell service at home and a way to supervise your children, temporary virtual education may be a good option for a week or two so that we can achieve more distance among students while they are at school.

If you choose for your child to be virtual, we ask that you contact your child's school Monday morning and inform them of your choice. Each campus has a protocol for Chromebook distribution. If you have cell service but no Wi-Fi internet, we may be able to help you. We discourage using flash drive virtual education because there is no direct interaction with teachers. But we will continue to load and distribute flash drives as necessary.

All extracurricular activities will continue as scheduled. Future modifications may be necessary. JCSD is in the process of recalculating stadium capacity for Friday's football game. More information will be shared when final decisions are made. We encourage Dragon Football fans to enjoy DSN's YouTube channel to watch the game.
