Ben Franklin Scholars Deadline: Nov. 15	Students with a 3.9+ GPA and 1320+ SAT and 28+ ACT will be invited to compete.	\$21,000 – \$26,000, plus two full tuition scholarships
Pulliam Journalism Scholarship Deadline: Nov. 15	By invitation only. GPA 3.0+. Essay required.	One full tuition scholarship
Academic Scholarships Priority Deadline: Dec. 1	Scholarship amounts are based on SAT/ACT scores, class rank and GPA.	Up to \$20,000
Fine Arts Audition/Portfolio Deadline: April 1	Students interested in music, art or theatre. Audition or portfolio required.	\$500 – \$1,000
Out-of-State	Admitted out-of-state applicants	\$1,000 – \$4,000
Alumni	Students with a sibling, parent or grandparent that graduated from Franklin College.	\$500 – \$2,000
