#### **ENGLISH:**

The English department has been working harder than ever to find ways to engage students in what's happening "in class." Students in 9th - 11th grades are trying a new system for reading books and articles called Actively. They read the books online and teachers can pose questions as they read for students to answer before they move on to the next section. Teachers can also see how long a student spent on reading and how far they got. In our hybrid situation, we felt this was a better option than trying to get books to students over the course of three weeks. We hope students find this experience and all the other changes we have had to make engaging. If you feel like your child is not engaged, please reach out to the teacher to seek help.

#### **MATHEMATICS**:

The math and science departments are excited to let you know that we have opened The Learning Center during lunch periods. State SAT with Essay October 14th, 2020

As part of the graduation requirements for the Class of 2021, all seniors will take part in the state SAT with Essay on October 14, 2020. The SAT, Scholastic Aptitude Test, is one of two college entrance exams students may take and is part of the school accountability data used by the state to show student growth. Students absent on the 14th will need to take the makeup exam on October 27th.

The schedule for the regular-length SAT with Essay is as follows:

8:30-9:15 Preadministration session

9:15-10:20 Reading Test (65 minutes)

10:20-10:30 Break

10:30-11:05 Writing and Language Test (35 minutes)

11:05-11:30 Math Test- No calculator (25 minutes)

11:30-11:35 Break

11:35-12:30 Math Test- Calculator (55 minutes)

12:30-12:32 Break

12:32 - 1:22 Essay (50 minutes)

1:22 - 1:30 Collect materials

\*Opportunity to go home for the day

Total: 4 hrs, 7 mins (+45 for preadministration)

Be sure to check out the SAT Student Guide. The Guide includes important information about the test as well as a practice exam. It is important that you carefully read the Guide and take the practice exam at home under timed conditions to gauge the pace

you'll need to maintain during the actual exam. Khan Academy is also a great resource for studying for the SAT.

#### IMPORTANT NOTES TO SHARE WITH YOU:

SLEEP AND EAT! A good night's sleep for at least three nights preceding the exam and healthy breakfast on October 14th are important for sustained mental focus and function.

BRING AN APPROVED CALCULATOR AND PENCILS with ERASERS!

Calculators are permitted and advantageous on the exam. We recommend that your student bring a fully charged calculator and fresh batteries. Please also bring at least two, non-mechanical #2 pencils.

CAREFULLY CHECK THE SAT STUDENT GUIDE FOR APPROVED TYPES OF CALCULATORS.

#### BE ON TIME!

The test will begin promptly at 8:30 am. Posters with room locations will be in the commons on the day of the test. Testing will conclude around 1:30 pm. Students can leave school when the test is over.

LEAVE YOUR CELL PHONES AND SMARTWATCHES AT HOME. DON'T BRING ANY ELECTRONICS INTO THE TESTING ROOM MAKE SURE TO KNOW YOUR HOME ADDRESS DO NOT BRING ANY FOOD INTO THE TESTING LOCATION
