State SAT with Essay October 14 th, 2020
As part of the graduation requirements for the Class of 2021 , all seniors will take part in the state SAT with Essay on October 14,
2020. The SAT, Scholastic Aptitude Test, is one of two college entrance exams students may take and is part of the school accountability data used by the state to show student growth. Students absent on the 14 th will need to take the makeupexam on October 27 th .

The schedule for the regular-length SAT with Essay is as follows:
8:30-9:15 Preadministration session
9:15-10:20 Reading Test ( 65 minutes)
10:20-10:30 Break

10:30-11:05 Writing and Language Test ( 35 minutes)
11:05-11:30 Math Test-No calculator (25 minutes)
11:30-11:35 Break
11:35-12:30 Math Test-Calculator ( 55 minutes )
12:30-12:32 Break

12:32-1:22 Essay ( 50 minutes)
1:22-1:30 Collect materials
*Opportunity to go home for the day
Total: 4 hrs, 7 mins ( +45 for preadministration)
Be sure to check out the SAT Student Guide. The Guide includes important information about the test as well as a practice exam.

It is important that you carefully read the Guide and take the practice exam at home under timed conditions to gauge the pace you'll need to maintain during the actual exam. Khan Academy is also a great resource for studying for the SAT.

Calculators are permitted and advantageous on the exam. We recommend that your student bring a fully charged calculator and freshbatteries. Please also bring at least two, non-mechanical \#2 pencils.

## BE ON TIME!

The test will begin promptly at 8:30 am. Posters with room locations will be in the commons on the day of the test. Testing will conclude around $1: 30 \mathrm{pm}$. Students can leave school when the test is over.

LEAVE YOUR CELL PHONES AND SMARTWATCHES AT HOME. DON'T BRING ANY ELECTRONICS INTO THE TESTING ROOM MAKE SURE TO KNOW YOUR HOME ADDRESS DO NOT BRING ANY FOOD INTO THE TESTING LOCATION
