

Adena High School Profile

The School: Adena High school is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The high school operates on a block schedule. The school year is divided into two eighteen week semesters. The day consists of eight 39 minute academic periods. The faculty consists of 16 full-time teachers and 6 part-time teachers. There are approximately 370 students in grades 9-12.

The Grading System: Number grades are used in reporting pupil progress. Final grades are calculated by averaging grades earned during each semester.

Grade Point Average: All courses are included in the cumulative grade point average. This is a non-weighted grade point average.

Class Rank: All courses are included in the class rank. Class rank is weighted, with advanced classes being awarded points on a 6pt scale, and regular classes being awarded points on a 4pt scale.

Class Rank: Class rank is based upon a weighted graded system.

Advanced classes include Accelerated Algebra I, Accelerated Algebra II, Accelerated Geometry, Advanced Math, Calculus, Statistics, Spanish (II, III, and IV), Chemistry, Physics and all Post-Secondary Options classes.

Advanced classes include Accelerated Algebra I, Accelerated Algebra II, Accelerated Geometry, Advanced Math, Calculus, Spanish II, III, and IV, Chemistry, Physics, Accelerated English I, II, and III, and all College Credit Plus Classes.

2020 Graduates: Approximately 40% of the graduates will attend 4-year colleges/universities, while less than 10% will attend 1-2 year schools. Their ACT composite average was 21. 10% received an "Honors" Diploma and 15% were members of the National Honor Society.

Graduation requirements: 22 units are required for graduation:

4 English, 4 Math, 3 Science, 3 Social Studies, 1 Fine Art, ½ Health, ½ Physical Education and 6 Electives.
