Please read for updates related to Northern Cass:

- 1. **Elementary and JH Transportation for Activities:** Due to lack of drivers, we will need parents of all elementary and junior high athletes to find alternative transportation to and from games. Please plan on this for the 2022-23 school year unless we are able to hire additional drivers. We will provide transportation if you can not make it work to transport your learner. We want every learner to participate in activities and hope this problem is not long-term. However, we must also be realistic in the fact bus drivers are nearly impossible to find right now. Please let Mr.. Laxdal or your coaches know if your child will be needing a ride. If we are able to transport, we will communicate at least one week in advance. If you are willing to carpool and take additional learners with you to events, Northern Cass can pay mileage to assist.

- 3. **PowerSchool v. Empower--The Difference (last week):** PowerSchool is our school information system (SIS) which is required by the state of North Dakota. It houses your learner's cumulative information such as attendance, communications, and transcripts. Empower is our learning management system which houses our evidence, playlists, and grades. Empower is where you can check on your learner's progress (grades) towards proficiency.

- 6. Procedures for Excusing Absences--IMPORTANT
  - Any day that a learner is absent, the parent/guardian must call the school to report the learner's absence, giving the name of the learner and the reason for the absence. Calls can be made between 7:00-9:00 a.m. at 874-2322. If the parent does not call the school, a representative of the school may call home to verify the absence. Parents/guardians e-mail attendance@northerncassschool.com prior to 9:00 a.m.
  - A note from the provider who is seeing your learner must be provided to the office upon the learner's return for it to be a medically excused absence. This will not count towards a learner's overall attendance.
  - o If the school office does not receive either a phone call or email from the parent within 48 hours of the absence, the absence will be considered unexcused, unless deemed otherwise by administration.

- 12. **ESPB Announces an Additional Way to Become a Substitute Teacher:** Beginning October 1, 2022, interim substitute licenses may be granted for substitute teachers with a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent (GED). The applicant must submit evidence of completion of the state-approved substitute training program, Frontline. The training is 12 modules and approximately 20 hours of work. The course covers professionalism, classroom management, student engagement, instructional strategies and working with at-risk students. The cost of the training is \$180.00. Applicants must also complete a BCI/FBI background check and pay an application fee. We look forward to this program increasing the pool of substitute teachers.
