- 3. Elementary and JH Transportation for Activities: Due to lack of drivers, we will need parents of all elementary and junior high athletes to find alternative transportation to and from games. Please plan on this for the 2022-23 school year unless we are able to hire additional drivers. We will provide transportation if you can not make it work to transport your learner. We want every learner to participate in activities and hope this problem is not long-term. However, we must also be realistic in the fact bus drivers are nearly impossible to find right now. - **6. Board of Education:** What employees does the Board hire and evaluate?
 - a. The only employees the school board directly hires are the superintendent and business manager. By law the board is required to evaluate the superintendent twice every year. A formative evaluation needs to be completed before Nov. 15th and a summative evaluation needs to be done before March 15th. Traditionally each board member completes an evaluation of the superintendent and then all nine evaluations are compiled into one document. The Board president and vice president meet with the superintendent to discuss the evaluation before the full board meets to accept the evaluation. The Northern Cass School Board currently delegates their evaluation of the business manager to the superintendent. In the past, the Board has also done a self-evaluation every other year, where each member evaluates how well the board works together and how effective the school board was in accomplishing the goals it set.

- 13. **ESPB Announces an Additional Way to Become a Substitute Teacher:** Beginning October 1, 2022, interim substitute licenses may be granted for substitute teachers with a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent (GED). The applicant must submit evidence of completion of the state-approved substitute training program, Frontline. The training is 12 modules and approximately 20 hours of work. The course covers professionalism, classroom management, student engagement, instructional strategies and working with at-risk students. The cost of the training is \$180.00. Applicants must also complete a BCI/FBI background check and pay an application fee. We look forward to this program increasing the pool of substitute teachers.
