



Both the 7th and 8th grade cheerleaders had an exciting year. Their efforts inspired the junior high teams to win the County Tournies in which they participated.







Soon the frustration of tests and the boredom of daily routine would be behind them.













The girls were under the leadership of Miss Hoey, who has been swim coach for two years.








Tracksters Spring Forward
