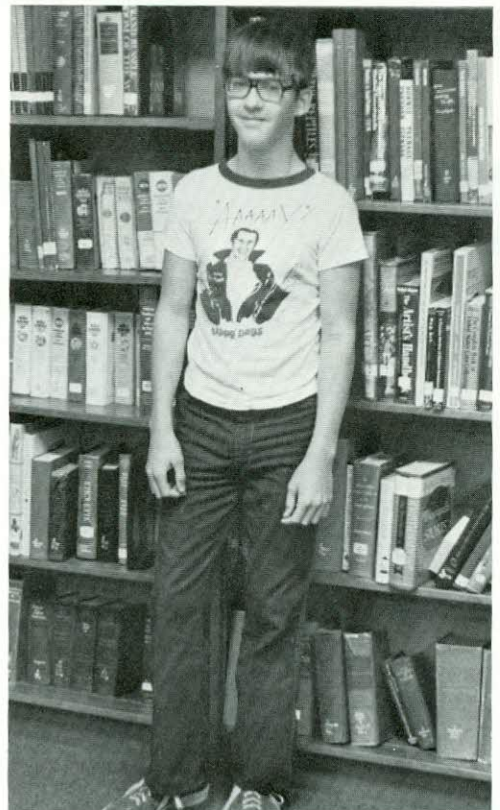
Lyons Wins With "Invincible"

Mr. Hawley earned his A.B. degree from Central Normal College in 1938, and his M.S. from IU in 1939.

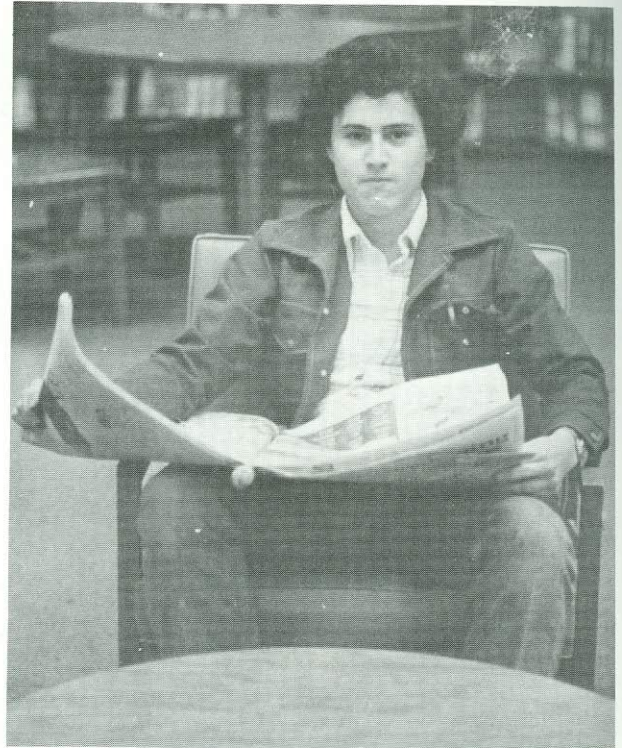
He observed, "Students have not changed too much in the years I have been teaching, but society has become more permissive and this has been reflected in the students."

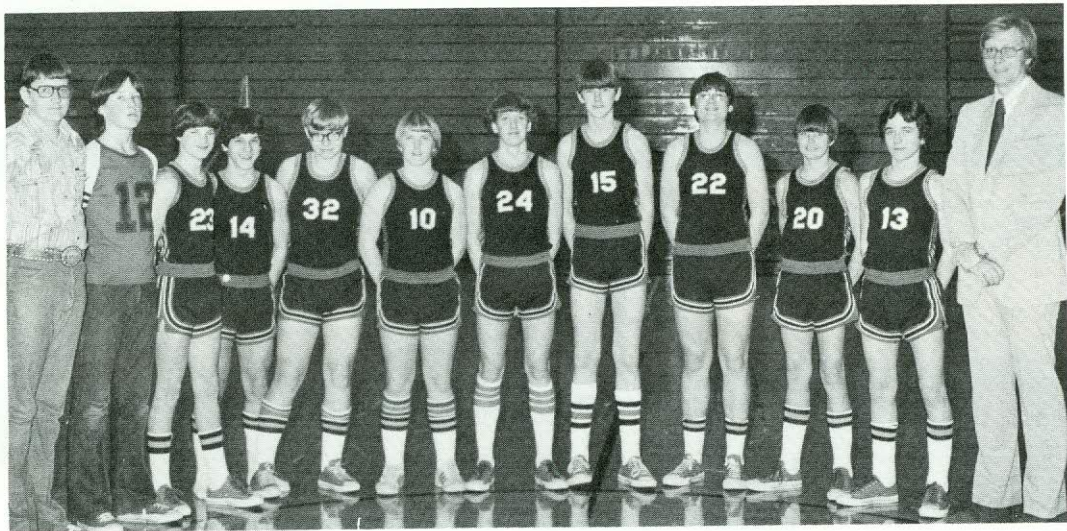
Freshmen Gain Experience

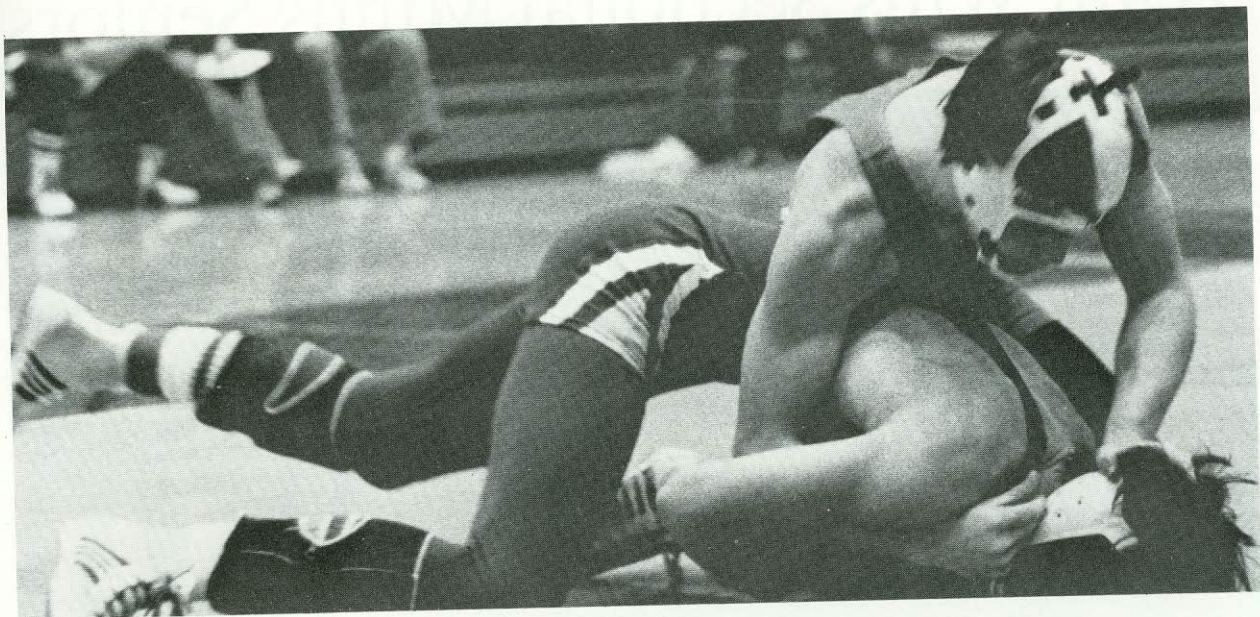

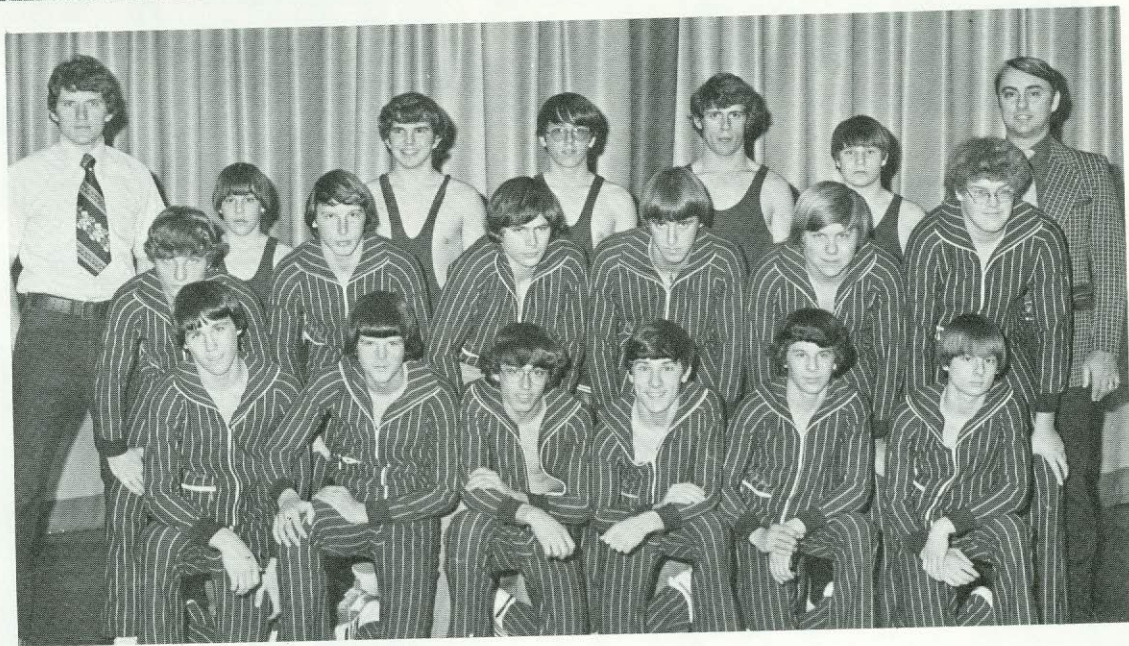
