

## Andrew Lin and Lydia Geiger Lead the Class of 2020

*Class Valedictorian, Andrew Lin*, the son of Amy Chen and Mike Lin, will attend the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, majoring in computer engineering and pursuing a minor in a foreign language. As announced earlier this year, Andrew earned a perfect score on the ACT, a standardized test used by many college admissions counselors in their review of applicants. This exceptional accomplishment is achieved by less than 0.2% of ACT test-takers. As part of his rigorous coursework at BHS,

he is a graduate of the Dr. Paul Stomper School of Science. The school, named for the distinguished BHS graduate who went on to become a successful physician and author, was created to provide recognition for our students who successfully complete a minimum of four of the more challenging science courses offered. In addition to his high school diploma, Andrew earned an associate's degree from Genesee Community College by participating in their Math Science Preparatory/Science, Technology, Engineering and Math Program during his middle and high school years.

On the BHS math team, he qualified for the county and state meets during his senior season. In addition, Andrew served as treasurer for both Student Government and for National Honor Society, and was a three-season scholar athlete who participated in varsity soccer, indoor track, and outdoor track teams all four years.

In addition to earning a MIT scholarship, Andrew received the NYS Academic Excellence Award, Batavia Business and Professional Women's Club Scholarship, Falcons Award, Walter Delbridge Memorial Award, Glenn S. Loomis American Legion Award, American History Award, and Batavia Coaches Association Scholar Athlete Award as well as Certificates of Excellence in Athletics. He was also offered many scholarships from other prestigious institutions

such as Boston University, Northeastern University, Carnegie Mellon University, Rochester Institute of Technology, and several SUNY colleges.

*Class Salutatorian, Lydia Geiger*, the daughter of Dan and Marsha Geiger, will attend SUNY Potsdam's Crane School of Music for bachelor degrees in Music Performance, Music Education, and possibly Musical Studies/Music Theory. In addition to her BHS

diploma, Lydia also graduated from the Honors Certificate Program at the prestigious Hochstein School of Music. As a Batavia student, Lydia was invited into both the National Honor Society and the Tri-M Music Honor Society, and proved to be an outstanding musician who immersed herself in the many available music courses and opportunities to perform. She also studied music theory at the Eastman Community School of Music. She has performed in several ensembles including the Hochstein Scholarship Flute Choir and the Hochstein Philharmonia Orchestra,

and in multiple masterclasses. Looking ahead, Lydia is scheduled to perform in the Honors Performance Series in Vienna, Austria, in 2021.

In addition to earning the SUNY Potsdam Provost Scholarship and the Crane Scholarship, Lydia is the recipient of the Eleanor R. Treiber Art Scholarship, the Batavia Lions Club Fine Arts Award, the Batavia Players Performing Arts Scholarship, the Batavia Kiwanis Club Band Award, the Frank E. Owen Music Educator Award/Scholarship, the US Marines Semper Fidelis Award, the John Philip Sousa Band Award, the Burk Family Scholarship for Performing Arts, the GWMEA (Genesee-Wyoming Music Educators Association) Scholarship, and the Batavia Business and Professional Women's Club Scholarship.

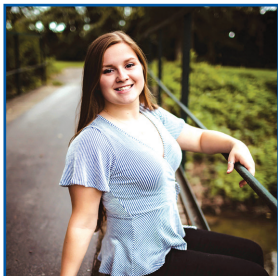

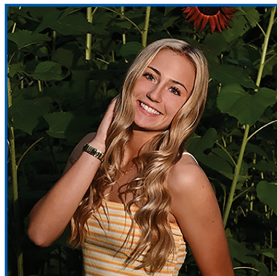

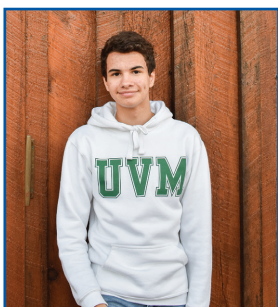

# The Class of 2020: Achievements and Aspirations

No one could have predicted, when the Class of 2020 returned to school last fall as seniors, that their final year at BHS would far surpass the typical senior-year description of being “memorable”. The shift for them and the impact to them due the coronavirus pandemic were enormous, but what they and others may find most memorable was the way these graduates - with the support of friends, family, staff, and the community - rewrote traditions with so much creativity and grace. Along with their academics, that ability to adapt may well be one of the greatest lessons they are carrying forward.

As for the noteworthy academic achievements, there are plenty of significant accomplishments by individuals in this class. The members of the Class of 2020 – and their families, teachers, and community – have much of which to be proud as they move on to pursue new educational and career goals. As confirmation of their efforts, more than 200 recognition and monetary awards were distributed to graduating seniors by colleges and universities, community organizations, employers, and the military. While most students plan to continue their schooling, others will immediately enter the U.S. Armed Forces or other employment.

Graduates are listed alphabetically and, for the many who wished to share them, their immediate future plans are included. (See page 2 for an abbreviation key for commonly mentioned degrees and schools.) Also noted are those ranked in the top ten percent of the class, those named as Batavia Teachers’ Association honor students for having earned a 90% or higher average during each year of high school, those who were selected and accepted the invitation to join honor societies based on academic achievements and conduct, and those who earned the distinction of graduating from the Dr. Paul Stomper School of Science at BHS by successfully completing a minimum of four of the more challenging science courses available at the High School.
