The BMI classifications for students in grades K, 2, and 4 at Barton Elementary School 2019-2020 are as follows: Males-healthy underweight 40.85 %, overweight and obese 26.39 %; females-healt or underweight 51.61%, overweight and obese 25.55%. Overall, BMI classification result for Barto Elementary School shows: 12.77% of all children measured in the overweight category and approximately 13.20% of all children measured were identified as obese. (3.23% of 4th graders we incomplete and 100% of 6th grade due to Covid 19)
