

THE LINCOLN and EMMA RAPENSKE TEACHING SCHOLARSHIP

This annual scholarship was established by Lincoln and Emma to provide an incentive and financial assistance to seniors entering the teaching field. It was Emma's love of and enthusiasm for teaching at Richfield Springs High School in the 1940's,50's and 60's that inspired her to encourage students toward teaching. She ended her career to devote full time to assisting Linc who was progressively losing his eyesight. Linc, a graduate of Richfield Springs, and except for time spent in the Air Force, was a lifetime resident of Richfield Springs. It was while in the service he encountered an undetermined and incurable eye problem eventually leading to an honorable, disability discharge and ultimately losing his eyesight. After Emma's passing in October 2015, at age 94, Linc arranged a financial endowment to Richfield Springs High School enabling this scholarship to continue for many, many years fulfilling Linc and Emma's wishes. Linc passed away in January 2017 at age 92. This scholarship thus became active in 2018.
