BAINS LOWER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

- Strategic focus on college and careers by offering 7 new career pathways: electrical, carpentry, welding, public service, certified nursing assistant, hospitality and digital media.

CELEBRATIONS

School Digger.com named West Feliciana the top school district in Louisiana for 2017.

West Feliciana was ranked No.1 in the state in End of Course testing for 2017.

West Feliciana Middle School teacher Janet Lathrop awarded the Louisiana Dream Teachers H. Norman Saurage III Service Award for 2017.

WFHS students ranked fourth statewide in overall ACT testing results with an overall composite of 21. Among African American students, WF ranked second (19.2). For economically disadvantaged students, WF was second (19.6) composite and for special education students, WF ranked second (19.6).

Boys Track & Field team were State champions in Class 3A for second year in a row and the girls team was runner-up in 2017.
