#### Broadband Implementation

- 200Mbps download / 200Mbps upload district wide
- 0.3Mbps per student
- All web access is controlled with a CIPA compliant filter

#### Internal Network

- 100% of classrooms have access to wired gigabit network access
- 100% of classrooms have wireless network coverage
