State Representative Report

Werner Horn, State Representative, shared some information about monetary adequacy aid to schools and the budget that was rejected by the governor as well as what the next steps are.

A brief discussion was held regarding Open Enrollment.

Finance Report (Business Administrator – Amanda Bergquist)

Update, Audits

Business Administrator Amanda Bergquist indicated that the 2014 audit for the Franklin School District has been completed. They have begun the 2015 audit.

Discussion was held regarding cell phone stipends for 2-3 administrators in the district at \$40 per month. A brief history was given as to the process.

MOTION: Peter Heath moved to approve paying for cell phone stipends for three administrators of the district, seconded by Greg Husband.

Motion Carried - Unanimous

Expenditure Report

The new report contains the new budget. There are two lines that need correcting.

Discussion was held regarding the upcoming Support Staff and Custodial negotiations. The committee will choose three dates to Amanda Bergquist to begin negotiations.

Amanda Bergquist requested the signature of the board on the MS 26c's.

Update from Superintendent

Daniel LeGallo, Superintendent, thanked everyone for their warm welcome. Superintendent LeGallo recognized and congratulated the FHS Girls Softball Team and Coaches who received the District 2 Sportsmanship Award given by the NH Softball Umpires Association. The banner will be displayed in the FMS gymnasium. The players will be present next month.

MOTION: Greg Husband moved to accept the nomination of Thomas Kaempfer as the FHS Computer Education Teacher for the 2015-16 School Year as presented by the Superintendent, seconded by Peter Heath.

Motion Carried – Unanimous

Superintendent LeGallo and Mr. Towne shared information about proposal to reverse the traffic pattern of the High School Front loop for safety and handicap accessibility reasons. Discussion was also held regarding the process the City of Franklin and School is working on to get this approved. There will be a public hearing on this matter as well as the City's code regarding school signs. There were some concerns shared regarding how this will affect the rest of the traffic flow. Some discussion was held regarding changing the flow of traffic for the rest of the area.

FHS Principal Report

Mr. Towne, FHS Principal, presented the board with a handout regarding the drop out rate which consists of 2013-14. A discussion was held regarding how these rates are calculated. Discussion was held regarding the need to look at a four year plan, focus on alternative programs, implementation of the Project AWARE program, and the hope to incorporate a home to school liaison.

Discussion was held regarding the High School and Alternative Education graduation; preparing students for the work force by working on work ethic, soft skills, incentives, collaboration; address attendance issues; the transition from PLATO to VLACS; and Department of Education early warning system values to risk factors. A committee

will be formed to review why the drop out rate is so high and what can be done to reduce it. Tamara Feener appointed Greg Husband to be Chairperson of that committee.

Franklin Youth Initative will be presenting to the school board and City in August.

There may be a contest to name the little brown shed at the High School.

Discussion was held regarding increasing the number of required community service hours from 40 hours. There will be review of other area schools' requirements and will be revisited in August.

FMS Principal Report

Kevin Barbour, FMS Principal, stated the number of students in each grade attending summer school; status update of where staff is in relation to the "Go Math" training; and the school building is 50% ready for the start of school. The furniture has all been moved to the appropriate buildings.

Jack Finley, FMS Assistant Principal, is working with Jim Richardson from the Division of Safety regarding safety and security. He is working with them on SAU Emergency Management. This includes an intensive look at each school's safety and security. He is also working on obtaining grants for such items as limited surveillance and access in the amount of \$20,000. Mr. Finley is also working with a group regarding emergency operation plans. Ralph Downes called three different engineers to look at different issues in the building but has not had any returned calls.

PSS Principal Report

Mike Hoyt, PSS Principal, stated that there are 80 children enrolled in summer school. Mr. Hoyt informed the board that there was a brown out in the electrical system last week which affected the air conditioning but is now being repaired. He stated the custodians are doing a wonderful job. Mr. Hoyt commended the parents, Garden Committee and students for all of their work in the incredible school garden. It was stated that there are 80 students going into 8th grade and 70 students going into 4th grade.

Open Enrollment

There currently 10 seats per grade from grade 4 through 9 for the 2015-16 school year. No students from the Franklin School District will be granted permission to go elsewhere through open enrollment.

Discussion was held regarding the board drafting something for legislative change to give to the representatives to help move this forward. The Board was in agreement to move forward with the process and have Daniel LeGallo do a press release/website/twitter account. So far, there are three Franklin Students who have enrolled in the new charter school K-5.
