Food Prices

Discussion was held regarding the cost of food and whether or not the costs have gone up. Franklin does participate in a buying group. Currently, 65% of students are receiving free or reduced lunch. Many families have multiple children and the cost would not be affordable. It is difficult times.

Budget Update

A copy of a PowerPoint presentation was provided to the Board and Public (Franklin School District Budget Summary 2016-17)

After consideration of all of the community members present and all of the students, staff, community members etc. at the last Franklin City Council Meeting, the board felt it is only right to honor the wishes of the constituents and education of our students to move forward with a fully funded Franklin School District budget.

MOTION: <u>Tim Dow moved to change the Franklin School District budget for 2016-17 back to the</u> <u>originally proposed amount of \$16,174,200.60 rather than the \$15,764,019 as requested by many of the</u> <u>students and community members, seconded by Scott Burns.</u>

The budget, prior to this reinstatement, was lacking in Technology and teachers. In order to move the students forward, these are necessary. We cannot expect teachers to teach without the necessary tools and teach effectively with the lack of teachers. It is important to fully fund the necessary education.

The Communication Committee has been working on a guide titled "Community Guide to Understanding the School Districts Budget". This should also be placed on the website.

POLICY

JBAB – Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming Students (NEW)

Discussion was held and many parents are concerned with the safety of the children/students. Many parents stated that they are uncomfortable with this policy. They inquired about what would happen if the schools refused to do this. This policy came directly from the New Hampshire School Board Association. It was stated that it will be approved as first reading but can be changed or denied.

65% of the graduating class started at PSS
31% did not
9% are Hill
½ of the students who did not start at Franklin dropped out
40% of those who dropped out are 16 years of age or older
Many of the families are in transition
Many students have other issues and problems going on in life
The truth about the community needs to be shared.
71% of the graduates moved on to higher education
9% moved on to the military
The question is how they are doing now...were they successful. Discussion was held regarding reinstating the contract with the Clearinghouse to be able to access this information which is believed to go back 10 years. The cost is uncertain at this time.

Discussion was held regarding the ASVAB testing past and current process.

Strategic Planning Sub Committee is meeting Wednesday night.

City Council is being presented with the Franklin School District Budget for 2016-17 tomorrow night.

Scholarship Night is being held tomorrow night.

The public thanked the board and administration for coming together in support of education for our students.

The students were recognized for speaking out about education at the last Franklin City Council Meeting. Everyone is very proud of them.

The staff and community members were recognized for being present and speaking up about education at the last Franklin City Council Meeting as well. Everyone was phenomenal.

Werner Horn was in support of surveys for people to fill out and mentioned incentivizing them to motivate returns. He also inquired about how adult education was funded? And if students paid tuition for classes? Is there a way to market the program? He also inquired about having a wall of honor in the high school dedicated to alumni who have and are serving the country.

It was clarified how Adult Education is funded and cost of tuition paid by students.
