



Peñasco/Picuris Community Memory Project

Dear parents and guardians,

PISD has received a grant from the Library of Congress to engage our students and families in the rich history, culture, and traditions of our community. One way we will do this is by showing students photographs taken in our community in the 1940s by two of the most famous photographers in American history. These photos are collected at the Library of Congress. Many of the people in those photos have relatives still living in the community, their homes are still lived in, and the activities they're doing are still things we do today (sometimes with different technology).

Starting in January, elementary after-school students will be bringing home a tripod and case for a phone in order to take photos inspired by the 1940s photos.

The project:

- 1. Talk with your students about these photos.
- 2. Help your student take photos of your house or family that are inspired by the old photos.
 - a. Text or email those photos to Mr. Noll: 575-779-1466, mnoll@penascoisd.com.
- 3. Or, find old photos that you already have. We can scan them so you can have a digital copy copy. We will send the originals back right away.
- 4. Help your student write a short description of the photos (who, where, what) and how they might be inspired by the old photos. (A couple of sentences will do!)
- 5. The students will create displays that (with your permission) will be included in a school event for families and can be used to teach our community history at school in the future.

Over the break, talk to your kids about your family history. If you have old photos, take a look at them! Share your history and stories with your kids!



This project is voluntary. A permission slip will be sent home and will determine how your photos are used (if at all).

You can look up old community photographs!

- 1. Go to https://www.loc.gov.
- 2. At the top of the page, choose "Photos, Prints, Drawings" from the menu.
- 3. Type in your village.
- 4. Click the magnifying glass icon.

Los Dichos de Peñasco Project

The languages of Northern New Mexico—both the Spanish dialect and Tiwa—are unique to our region. In Peñasco and the surrounding villages, we have words and phrases that are known only here. In this project, students will be exploring these palabras, dichos, and cuentos. The goal is for students to learn Spanish and Tiwa *and* about the culture and history of their homes!

The Project

- Talk with your students about the example words and phrases below. They may have been used differently in your house. What do they mean to you?
- Tell stories about your grandparents, aunts and uncles, and family and the words and sayings they used.
- Help your student write down one (or more) words and phrases, with translations.
- We will use these words and phrases to create a book of dichos from Peñasco.

Examples: Dichos

- A volar sin alas: "To fly without wings." Used by parents to kids: get out of here, out of my hair.
- De tal palo tal astilla: "From such a stick, such a splinter." Used as: like father, like son.
- Tanto hizo el diablo consu hijo que lo hizo tuerto: "The devil did so much with his son that he made him cross-eyed." Used as: took things too far.

Examples: Palabras

- Jara: red willows
- Hito: contraction of hijito

Brainstorming Ideas

- Words that you don't know the English translation for—or that has no translation.
- Phrases used in these types of situations:
 - When someone is mad
 - When someone is hungry
 - When someone is sad or in pain
 - When it's raining or snowing hard
 - When it's hot and dry
 - When it's very cold
 - When someone doesn't know what they're doing

- When something is spooky
- When there is good or bad luck
- When someone is lazy or a hard worker
- When someone is a fool
- When you've eaten too much
- When someone is new to something
- When someone has a bad temper
- When someone runs their mouth too much

Once you start talking about these situations and phrases, you may be reminded of many more that aren't listed here. That's great! Help us preserve this part of our history!

Over the break, talk to your kids about sayings, jokes, and stories you heard when you were a kid. Talk with the grandparents and elders in your family.

Share your culture and language with your kids!


