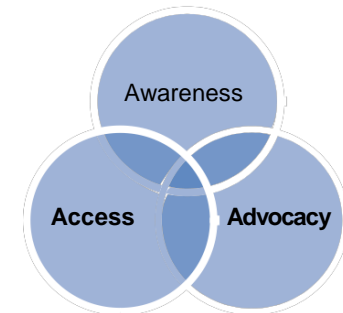

If someone needs information or referral services, dialing 211 is available on a 24-hour basis to connect residents to a wide variety of social services across the state. A professional will then either refer or connect that caller to the correct agency based on the services needed. Callers to 211 can get LIVE assistance with needs such as: food, shelter, counseling, income supports, employment, healthcare, and services for specialized populations such as the elderly and persons with disabilities and much more. All calls are free, anonymous and confidential.
