Cultural and Other Educational Opportunities

The Franklin Footlight Theatre and the FHS Players, both of which are housed at the historic Franklin Opera House, offer excellent performing arts and cultural programs throughout the year. A number of Franklin students and faculty are involved in, or attend, these performances. FACT (Franklin Area Children's Theater) runs each summer with an educational theater arts program for kids grades K-12 and culminates in a final production of over 100 students from the district and surrounding communities. This group allows teenagers to use their skills in teaching younger students as they spend the summer as interns, and allows the younger students to learn the skills and various aspects of the performing arts. In addition, both a local recreation department and the fire explorers offer students a wide variety of opportunities.

Colleges nearby include: Colby-Sawyer (New London), NH Technical College (Concord), Lakes Region Community College in Laconia, New England College(Henniker),Plymouth State

UniversityandSouthernNH University(Hooksett). These schools offer a wide array of performing arts, art galleries and sporting events.

School and Community Profile

Franklin High School is located in the City of Franklin, (pop. 8,500), 90 miles north of Boston at the point where the Pemigewasset and Winnepesaukee Rivers merge to form the Merrimack River. Situated in central NH, in Merrimack County, Franklin is only five miles west of Interstate 93. It is also in close proximity to some of the major lakes of NH (Winnepesaukee, Squam, Winnisquam and Newfound) as well as the shopping malls in Concord and Tilton.

The Franklin public school system is governed by an elected, nine-member Board of Education. Franklin and Hill are served by School Administrative Unit 18 (offices located within the high school complex).

Franklin's primary industries and sources of employment are Fruedenburg-NOK and Webster Valve. Major service-related employers are Franklin Regional Hospital and Hannaford. Other smaller manufacturing plants and businesses employ the majority of the remaining labor force.

The school's characteristics reflect the community's diverse backgrounds. The majority of residents come from French Canadian, Polish, English and Old New England backgrounds. There are very few minorities living in the city or attending Franklin schools.

FHS currently has an enrollment of 328 students, grades 9-12.
