

INSTRUCTIONS:

Please review the following information and use the application checklist listed below to organize and prepare your online scholarship application.

- For ease of submission, please do not use the Internet Explorer browser as it may not be compatible with the online application system on all computers. The following browsers are recommended: Google Chrome, Apple Safari, Microsoft Edge, or Mozilla Firefox
- Enter and upload all your required information and documents using the online application portal (eg. personal statements, transcripts, activities, proof of citizenship). No emailed information will be accepted. All information must be submitted by the deadline. No exceptions will be made or granted.
- It is highly recommended that you begin your application at least two weeks prior to the January 31, 2023 deadline to ensure the online receipt of recommendations from individuals providing references on your behalf.
- After setting up your online scholarship application, you will enter the email addresses of two, but no more than four
 references. Individuals providing recommendations will submit their confidential information directly into your application using an invitation they will receive from the online system. They will enter their reference directly into the
 online form connected to your application. No uploaded or emailed letters of recommendation will be accepted.
- Submission of your photograph on any uploaded document will result in your application being disqualified. This includes a photograph appearing on your transcript, passport, or resume.
- Please note, once a document is uploaded into your application it cannot be deleted. So please be sure you are uploading the correct document.

- Caroline E. Holt Nursing Scholarship: A one-time \$2,500 award to three nursing students who have financial need.

Pennsylvania State Society DAR Student Scholarship

Originally established in 1935, as a revolving fund with donations from Pennsylvania members and chapters, loans were made to students in accredited colleges and nursing schools. Prior to 1990, the fund was changed to the Pennsylvania State Society DAR Student Scholarship. This scholarship is available to any high school senior residing in Pennsylvania who is graduating from a secondary school that is registered, accredited, approved, or licensed through the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The applicant must provide a copy of their acceptance into an accredited program at a college/university. Eligibility for this scholarship is not limited to a specific field or area of study.

Louise V. Nelson Nursing Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1962 as a bequest from the estate of Louise Nelson, regent of the Fort Hand Chapter NSDAR. This scholarship is available to any high school senior residing in Pennsylvania who is graduating from a secondary school that is registered, accredited, approved, or licensed through the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The applicant must provide a copy of their acceptance into an accredited nursing program at a hospital or college/university.

Mary Reider American History Scholarship

The listed scholarship was established in 1996 by Lorraine K. Prutzman, Pennsylvania State DAR Scholarship Chair. It is available to any high school senior residing in Pennsylvania who is graduating from a secondary school that is registered, accredited, approved, or licensed through the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The applicant must provide a copy of their acceptance into a course of study in American history at an accredited college/university.

Elizabeth W. Watkins STEM Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 2022, by Elizabeth A. Watkins, Pennsylvania State Regent. 
