ARKANSAS READY FOR LEARNING PLAN:

Ready for Learning Expectations

District Plan

Ensure the continuity of teaching and learning by providing:

A guaranteed and viable curriculum that includes:

The Lake Hamilton collaborative teacher teams have identified essential standards for each content area according to the Arkansas Academic Standards. All students will have the opportunity to learn the grade and subject academic standards in the following settings:

*On-site blended learning

*Virtual learning

Blended Learning (K-12)

Blended learning classrooms will allow students to continue learning grade level or content standards through face-to-face instruction and technology-based approaches. Both students and teachers will be prepared to move to online learning in case of ADH mandates and/or school closures. Chromebooks will be available to all students whether they have selected on-site blended learning or virtual learning.

Virtual learning will be offered through the Lake Hamilton Virtual Academy.

Flexible Fridays-

The Lake Hamilton School District will begin offering "Flexible Fridays" to 4 - 12th-grade students on Fridays of each week beginning Friday, October 30, 2020, until the end of the semester. K - 3rd-grade students will continue their normal schedule and will not participate in Flexible Fridays.

Why is the District implementing Flexible Fridays for 4 - 12th-grade onsite students?

After receiving input from teachers, parents, administrators, members of the Ready for Learning team, school leadership team, and the personnel policies committee, the District found that Flexible Fridays would benefit 4 - 12th grade onsite students and teachers by:

- 1. Reducing potential exposures by reducing the time onsite at the schools and grade levels most impacted by COVID-19
- 2. Reducing the number of students on-site at the schools and grade levels most impacted by COVID-19
- 3. Increasing planning time for teachers that are serving both virtual and onsite learners

How will Flexible Fridays work for 4 - 12th grade onsite students?

All 4 - 12th grade onsite students will have the option to attend school onsite or online on Flexible Fridays. Learners will participate in online interactive lessons provided by their own classroom teachers. Flexible Fridays will allow time for remediation and/or enrichment of the essential skills and knowledge. Students who report onsite will engage in the same activities as those students who choose to learn from home during Flexible Fridays.

Diagnostic Assessments (K-8)

The diagnostic assessment that will be used to identify learning gaps for grades k-2 is iStation and for grades 3-8 is NWFA.

Identify how to address unfinished learning from the prior year by using:

Arkansas Playbook

Planning for Re-engagement

The Lake Hamilton School District will address unfinished learning from the prior year by using district-developed resources and the Arkansas Playbook: Addressing Unfinished Learning.

For students who re-enter onsite instruction, the school will provide support in student procedural review, socialemotional areas, new learning processes, on-site instruction guidelines, and expectations, technology use and safety, as well as pivoting considerations.

The first few weeks of school will be used for student screening and assessment of essential standards. Units of instruction from the Arkansas Playbook will be used as a guide to address unfinished learning. The specific resources that will be used include Social/Emotional Strategies, Support Plans, and Family and Community Engagement resources.

Utilize a Learning Management System

Students in grades k-7 will utilize Seesaw as a learning management system. Seesaw is a platform that is user friendly and provides a digital environment that is suitable for primary, elementary, and middle school students.

Students in grades 8-12 will utilize Canvas. This learning management platform is more suitable for secondary students.

Schedule teacher training for how to use the LMS

August 10-14 has been set aside for Ready for Learning professional development of all staff in the selected learning management system. Ongoing training and support will be provided by recorded videos, media specialists, instructional facilitators, and building level super users.

Schedule teacher training for blended learning (delivery of instruction)

August 10-14 has been set aside for Ready for Learning professional development of all staff in blended learning strategies using a variety of methods: Team Digital resources, Modern Classroom videos, resources within the LMS, staff members who have blended learning expertise will provide ongoing support.

Provide support for parents and students

Technology Support- Acceptable Use Agreement document, Chromebooks for each student, District wi-fi available on campus, Internet access to families through a partnership with Resort Cable, Mi-Fi devices for students living in remote areas, a special hotline set up for tech support.

Social-Emotional Support-Access to the district School-Based Mental Health Providers, School-Based Social Worker, Partnership with four community mental health agencies that provide Individual and family counseling sessions, and two school counselors available at each school.

Academic Support-Email, Phone conferences, Parent tutorials for accessing the learning management system, Google Meet conferences, In-person conferences by appointment with health and safety guidelines in place, Interpreting and Translating services.

Physical Support- Lake Hamilton Parent Center- The center can provide access to families in need with food, clothing, and community resources. District McKinney-Vento / Foster Care/ and Military Family Liaison.

- · Transition plans will be communicated to stakeholders via the communication methods listed above and placed on the district website "LHSD is Here" section.
- · LHSD will utilize the School Communication Flow Chart for health issues related to COVID-19.
- · LHSD has developed prepared statements for websites, emails, media requests, and social media in conjunction with the National School Public Relations Association (NSPRA) COVID-19 Resource Center and NSPRA Complete Crisis Communication Management Manual for Schools.
- · LHSD will utilize CDC Communication Resources as needed.

District Expectations for Regular Two-Way Communication Between Teachers and Parents:

- · Web and virtual communication tools will be the preferred method for regular two-way communication between teachers and parents. For those without web and virtual communication capabilities, phone calls will be the preferred method for regular two-way communication between teachers and parents.
- · Modes of communication for regular two-way communication between teachers and parents include: Canvas Discussion Boards, SeeSaw, Email, Class Dojo, Google Classroom / Google Meet, Remind, Text Message, and Phone Call.
- · Feedback loops will be monitored by Google Form Surveys, Canvas Student Log Activity Reports, and/or teacher logbooks.

When Schools Are Open and Operating:

- · LHSD will continue to regularly communicate with parents and stakeholders about safety, learning, and transition information via the web, mass notification systems, school app, and through social media channels.
- · LHSD will evaluate the consistency of messaging across all media tools and all buildings by hosting monthly virtual meetings with district and building level communications representatives and administrators.
