Dear Wellsville School Community,

The Wellsville Local School District is committed to the safety and health of our students and staff. We want to inform you that that we have recently received information that a staff member in one of our classrooms tested positive for COVID-19. We are working closely with the Columbiana County Health Department and anyone identified as a close contact will be notified by the health department as a part of COVID-19 investigation.

Cleaning and disinfecting of the exposed locations has been completed.

The Wellsville Local School District will remain OPEN at this time.

If you have been contacted about your child being quarantine, we ask you to take these steps to continue to be aware of your child's health:

1. As a precaution, consider postponing plans for play dates, family visits, and extracurricular and social activities for the next 14 days.
2. Continue to check your child for COVID-19 symptoms daily: fever or chills, new uncontrolled cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, new onset of severe headache, especially with fever.
 - If anyone in your household develops symptoms or tests positive for COVID-19, they should immediately isolate and call *the Columbiana County Health Department at 330 424 0272*. Also contact your medical providers.
 - If NO symptoms develop and you have not been instructed otherwise to quarantine for a different exposure, your child may continue to attend school when contacted by the Columbiana County Health Department.



COVID-19 FAQ's

What to do if you're sick or suspect you're sick:

- ▲ **Keep in touch with your doctor.**
Contact your doctor and be sure to call before you go in. Get care if you feel worse or believe there is an emergency.
- ▲ **Stay home except to get medical care.**
People who are mildly ill with COVID-19 are able to recover at home but should not leave or visit public areas. Use CDC criteria to determine when you can stop isolating and leave home.
- ▲ **Don't be afraid to ask for help.**
Ask a family member, friend, or neighbor to get your groceries, mail, and other essential needs and leave them outside your door.
