

The Babbling Brooks was the Select Theatre performance this year. The story is about a family of gossips in the 1950s, the mother Nettie Brooks (Emma Spencer) is the biggest gossip in town and it all goes south when her daughter Betty Brooks (Elena Crawford) decides to form a newspaper called "The Babbler." The staff is made up of her friends played by Isa Silva, Theo Cooke, David Howard, and Josie Miller. When writing "The Babbler," Betty overhears the two girls who live upstairs talking about murdering a man named Merrill. Betty then decides to publish this on the front page of the newspaper, grabbing the attention of everyone in the neighborhood, including Sheriff Weston (Jordan Norris) who is dating Nettie Brooks's eldest daughter Norma Brooks (Jessica Pouge), Sheriff Weston quickly interrogates Betty on how she got the story and Betty then tells the Sheriff about the girls upstairs Carol (Natalie Oler) and Julia (Maddy Morgan). The girls then explain how many murders they've "committed" in the end it all comes out that Carol and Julia are big name playwrights on TV. This mishap means things don't look too great for the Brooks family.

This is just a brief description of this show. There were so many more wonderful characters and actors including Granny also known as Debby (Cayla Harris), Homer Brooks (Ian Paloza), Bonnie Burns (Marie Henn), and Bessie Horton (Reagan Polk).

Curious about your Candy? Here're the Deets:

Halloween. Known for fun costumes, scary movies, fall weather, and of course... CANDY! According to the National Confectioners Association, Halloween candy sales are up 13% compared with 2019. That means that Americans are spending about \$8.05 billion this year to hopefully spread some spooky cheer.

Candyindustry.com tells us that the top selling Candies this year are: Skittles, Reese's, M&M's, Snickers, and Starburst! A quick google search can easily fill you in on the ingredients of these top selling treats, but because nobody has time to google the ingredients of DELICIOUS candy, I did it for you!

- **#1 Seller Skittles**. Brought to light in 1974, this crunchy, chewy, tart candy contains sugar, corn syrup, hydrogenated palm kernel oil, fruit juice, citric acid, and natural and artificial flavor. According to foods author, Stacy Zogheib, hydrogenated palm kernel oil is a liquid made partially solid to help with stability. Fall Recipes

For this spooky season, we've got 3 warm fall meals for you, for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Enjoy the cooler weather, and pair these treats with hot cocoa, a PSL, or your favorite fall drink. Enjoy!

Pumpkin Spice Pancakes

1 1/2 c. all-purpose flour

3 tsp. baking powder

2 tbsp. packed light brown sugar

1 tsp. kosher salt

1 tsp. cinnamon

1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg

1/4 tsp. ground ginger

1 c. milk

1 c. pumpkin puree

2 large eggs

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

- 1. In a large bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, brown sugar, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, and ginger.
- 2. In a separate bowl, whisk together milk and pumpkin puree, then add eggs and stir in vanilla.
- 3. Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients and stir with a wooden spoon until just combined.
- 4. Melt butter in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat. When butter is foamy, reduce heat to medium-low and ladle pancake batter into skillet. Cook until bubbles start to form in batter and pancake is golden underneath, about 3 minutes then flip and cook the other side until golden, another 3 minutes.

Stuffed Peppers

1/2 c. uncooked rice

2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling

1 medium onion, chopped

2 tbsp. tomato paste

3 cloves garlic, minced

1 lb. ground beef

1 (14.5-oz.) can diced tomatoes

tomatoes

 $1\ 1/2\ \mathrm{tsp.}$ dried oregano

Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper 6 bell peppers, tops and cores



1 c. shredded Monterey jack

Freshly chopped parsley, for garnish

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°. In a small saucepan, prepare rice. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil.
- 2. Cook onion until soft, about 5 minutes. Stir in tomato paste and garlic and cook until fragrant.
- 3. Add ground beef and cook, breaking up meat with a wooden spoon, until no longer pink, 6 minutes. Drain fat.
- 4. Return beef mixture to skillet, then stir in cooked rice and diced tomatoes. Season with oregano, salt, and pepper. Let simmer until liquid has reduced slightly, about 5 minutes.
- 5. Place peppers cut side-up in a 9"-x-13" baking dish and drizzle with oil. Spoon beef mixture into each pepper and top with Monterey jack, then cover baking dish with foil.
- 6. Bake until peppers are tender, about 35 minutes. Uncover and bake until cheese is bubbly, 10 minutes more.



Extra-virgin olive oil, for drizzling

1 c. chopped pepperoni

2 c. marinara

2 c. shredded mozzarella

1/4 c. chopped parsley -gimmesomeoven.com



- 1. Preheat oven to 400°. Place spaghetti squash on a plate and microwave 5 minutes. Halve each lengthwise and remove any seeds (be careful of hot steam!).
- 2. Transfer to a parchment-lined baking sheet, season with salt and pepper, and drizzle with olive oil.
- 3. Bake, cut-side down, for 30 minutes. Remove from oven and heat broiler.
- 4. Meanwhile, in a small skillet over medium heat, crisp pepperoni, stirring occasionally. Transfer to a plate.
- 5. Loosen spaghetti strands using a fork. Add 1/2 cup marinara, 1/4 cup mozzarella, and 1/4 cup crispy pepperoni to each baked squash half. Mix filling with a fork and top with 1/4 cup more mozzarella and parsley. Return to baking sheet.
- 6. Broil until cheese is melted and golden.
