



No School Delays or Closures During Remote Learning

Snow days will look a little different for Carlsbad Municipal Schools during remote learning. No need to wait for a call, monitor social media, or check the CMS website. As long as students are learning in the red (remotely), classes will continue on time and as scheduled come rain or shine, sleet or snow.

The only students whose schedules may be impacted by inclement weather are those in the CMS Special Ed in the Red program who attend school in small groups. Those families will be notified when classes need to be moved online during inclement weather.

CMS, as always, will accommodate students who lose internet access during a storm. Students are encouraged to complete assignments or engage in learning that doesn't require connectivity. Once power is restored, they should touch base with their teachers and make arrangements to make up work, just as they would if they missed class during a more traditional school year. Attendance during remote learning is based on engagement, so as long as students are engaged, a power outage shouldn't impact their learning.

CMS will not be serving grab and go meals during inclement weather.

Once CMS schools shift to yellow – a hybrid model that combines in-person and online learning – weather delays will be announced through more traditional means including robocalls, social media and CMS website at Carlsbadschools.net.
