

# FBC.E - Provider Instructions For Use Of Certificate Of Immunization

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS (Physician or clinic may recommend additional doses.)

Children/students must be immunized age-appropriately according to Advisory Committee of Immunization Practices (ACIP) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. (See below)

\* One dose must have been given on or after the 4th birthday. Three Td required for children age 7 or older not previously vaccinated.

† **In all IPV or all OPV schedule:** IF the third dose was given on or after the 4th birthday, the fourth dose is not required. If a child has received a total of four doses of **any combination** of OPV and IPV at least four weeks apart, he/she is considered adequately immunized against polio.

¶ Two doses of MMR given on or after the 1st birthday are required for children who entered

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kindergarten or first grade in the 1992/1993 school year and thereafter. Each subsequent year, the next highest grade will be included.

- £ Effective with the 2000/2001 school year and thereafter, three doses of hepatitis B vaccine are required for entrance into kindergarten (or first grade if the student's school does not have a kindergarten.) Each subsequent year, the next highest grade will be included.
