#### SCHOOL VACCINE REQUIREMENTS Distance Learning during COVID-19



The Department of Health and Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction feel strongly about the importance of keeping our students, staff, and their families safe and healthy. They understand that during these extraordinary times, there may be questions and concerns about school immunization requirements as we begin this unique school year. Following are some things to keep in mind:

- It is important to keep students up to date on their immunizations. Students who are behind on required immunizations will need to be in compliance before scheduled in-person learning
- Keeping students vaccinated will protect more than just the student. It also protects friends, family, and the community from disease outbreaks, such as measles. We've seen multiple disease outbreaks throughout the state in the past few years, and we don't want to experience another, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Getting a student in to a health care provider is about more than vaccinations. Well child visits ensure students get continued medical check-ups. These visits ensure the student is healthy and prepared to learn.

#### Free Meals Program Extended

Free to-go meals (lunch and breakfast) for children aged 1-18 are available at each elementary school Monday through Friday, 11:00 am - 12:30 pm and through bus routes in areas not close to the schools.

At Marshall, Miss Kitty is handing out the to-go bags of meals by the gym. Please feel free to stop by and pick up one bag per child.

Remember, you need not be a student of the Marysville School District to access this program. All Marysville residents aged 1–18 are eligible.

### Free / Reduced Meals Application

Please consider completing and returning a Free and Reduced Price Meal Application as soon as possible, even if you feel you may not qualify. Circumstances have changed for many families: therefore, you may qualify now whereas you might not have in the past. Only one form is necessary for each family.

Additionally, completed applications for qualified families help to provide critical funding for academic and social-emotional services for students through the Learning Assistance Program and Title 1 assistance at schools across the district.
