Serving the class as sponsors were Mr. Arlo J. Ewy and Mr. Norman Stoppel.




The Future Farmers of America is an organization of farm boys who want to learn new and improved methods of farming. They meet twice a week for instructive and entertaining programs.

Key Club—"The Doing Something Club"






