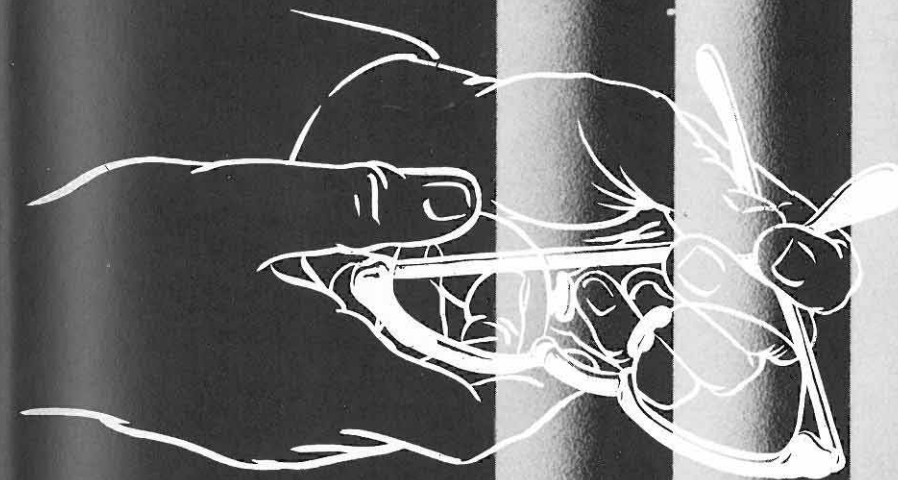

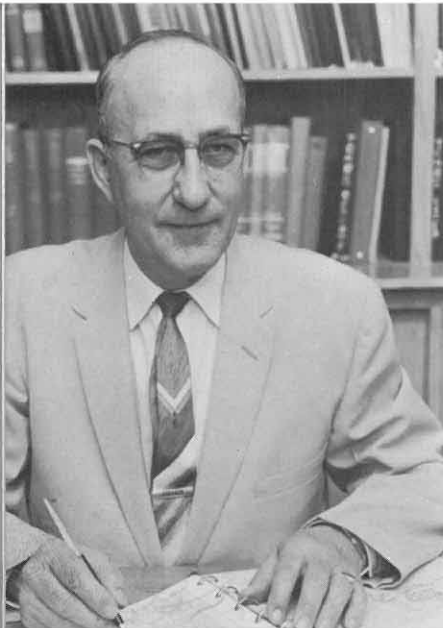
## FOREWORD

Some very prominent guest speakers have been featured at the bi-weekly Hi-Y meetings. The group also entertained the Y-Teens at several skating parties.

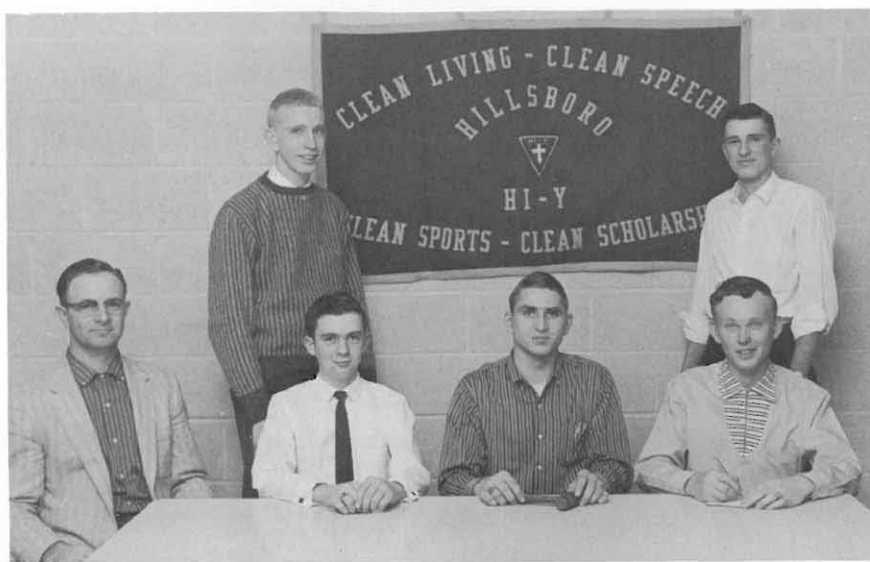
The highlights of the year were the Father-Son banquet and the donating of fifteen dollars to the hospital for picture frames.

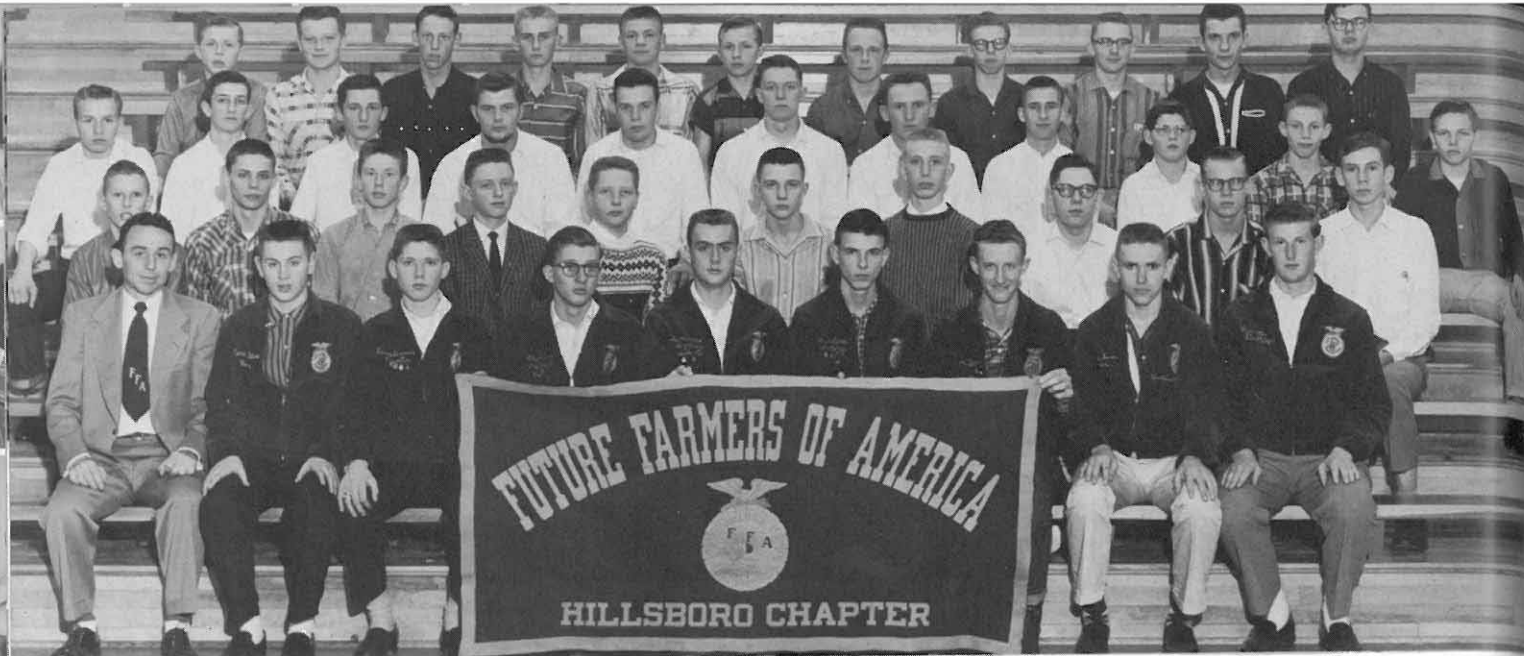

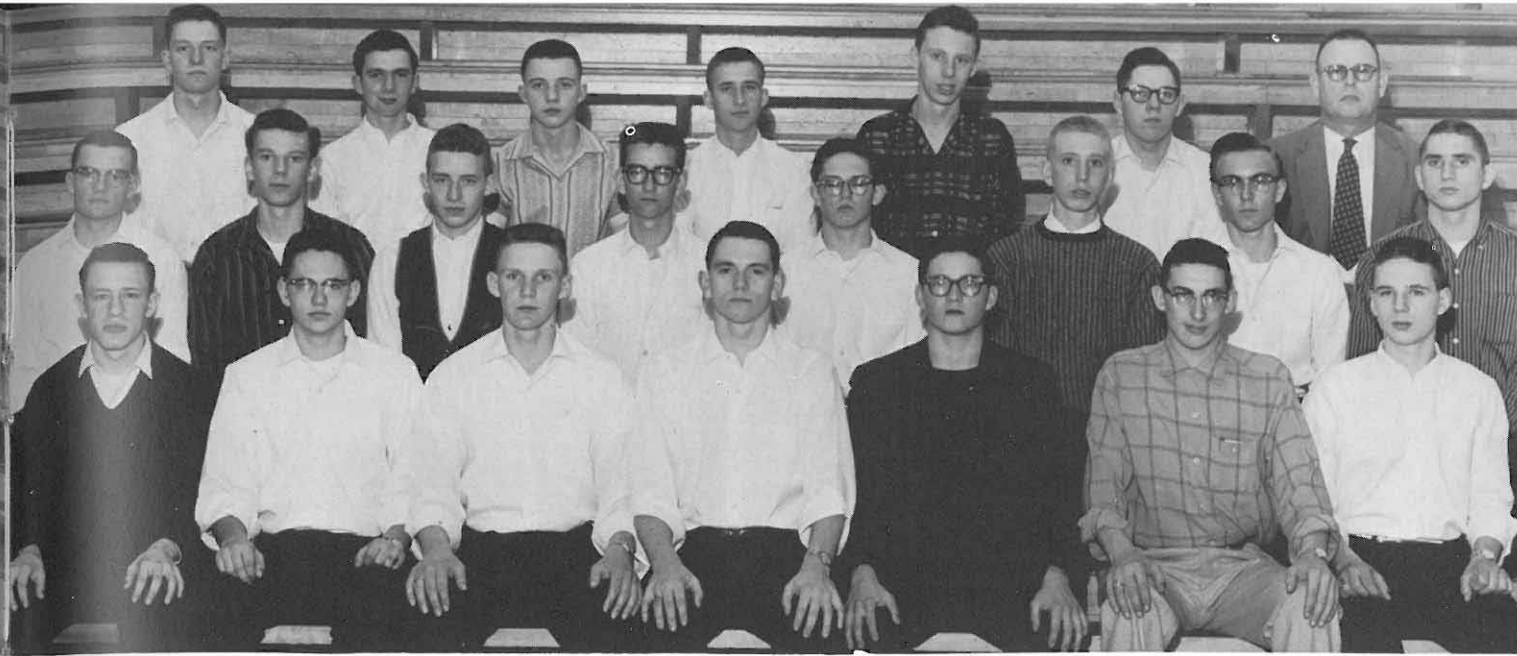
## F.F.A.

The boys served the community at Christmas by making and displaying a large star and by bringing a basket of fruit to Cedar Rest Home.

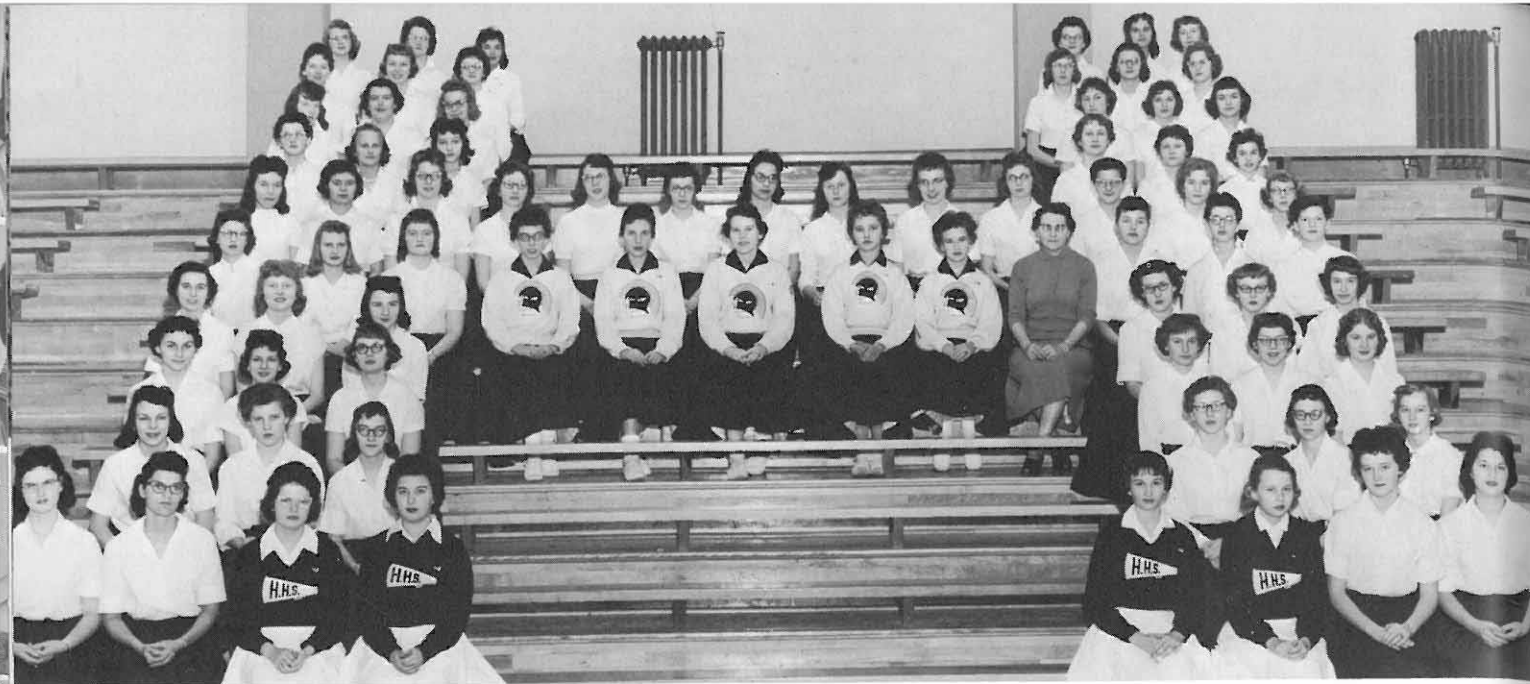
Money-raising projects were a Christmas card sale and a car wash. At their bi-weekly luncheon meetings, they engage interesting speakers, view films, and have business meetings.

Probably the most outstanding play of the season was a 78-yard run for a touchdown by Willard Dahl against Cottonwood Falls in the final game of the season.



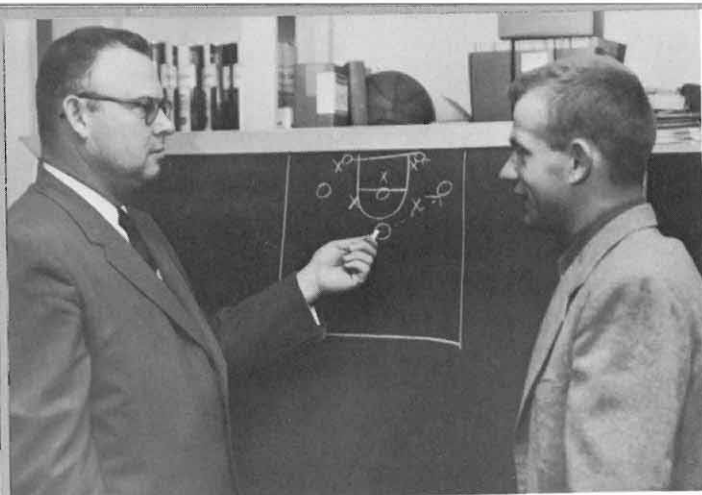

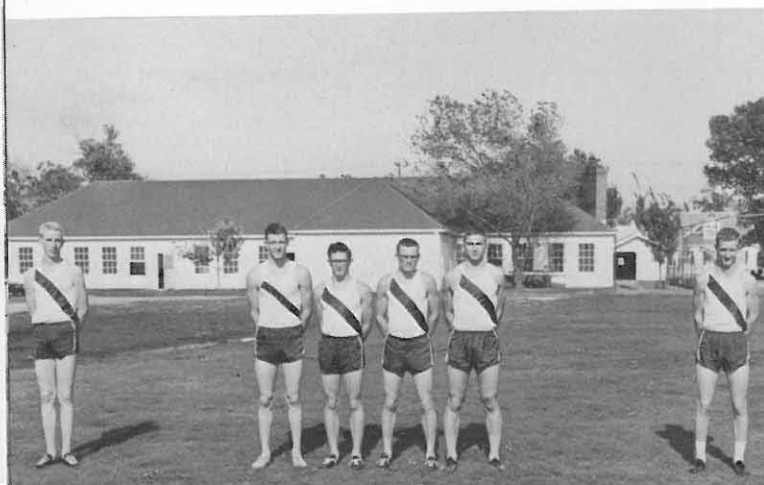
Coach Balzer's wing-footed Trojans made the 1959 track season a highly successful one. For the first time in eleven years the Trojans won the CVL championship trophy, tying for first place with Marion. Many of the school records were broken this year, with Willard Dahl setting a new school record of 15:5 in the high hurdles. Jay Harder, breaking three of his brother's records, ran the 100-yard dash in 10:02:5, the 220 in 22:2, and the low hurdles in 20:5. The medley relay team composed of Allen Hiebert, Dennis Heinrichs, Jay Harder, and Willard Dahl set a new CVL record and then went on to break that record in the State, running it in 3:49.3. In the State Meet Chester Funk replaced the injured Willard Dahl in the anchor 880.

The six boys qualifying for the regionals at Sterling were Paul Hiebert, Allen Hiebert, Dennis Heinrichs, Jay Harder, Willard Dahl, and Chester Funk.

Those qualifying for the State were the medley relay team and Jay Harder, who qualified in the 100-yard dash, low hurdles, and the 220-yard dash. In the State Harder placed fifth in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes.

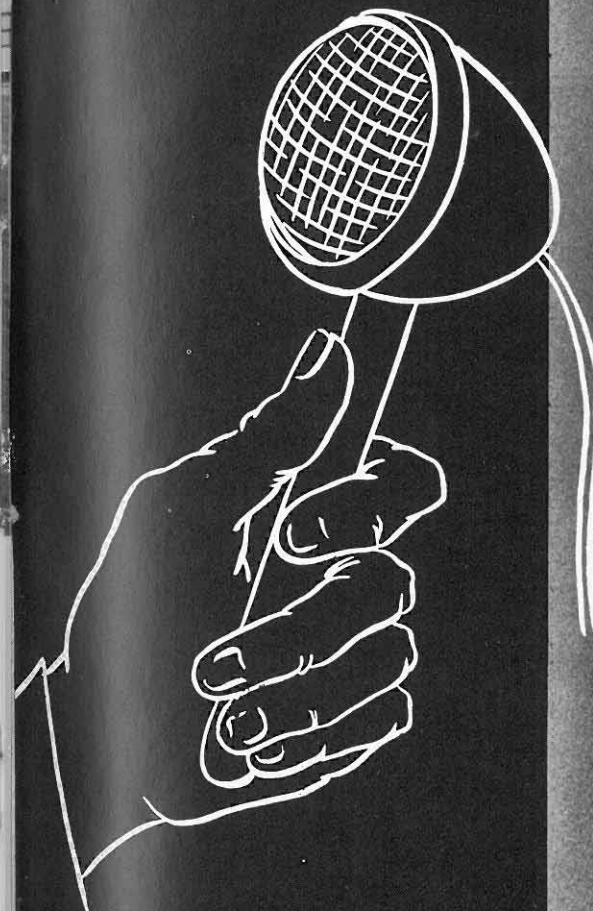
