

SCHOOL BOARD

The superintendent, principal, and school board work and plan together to improve and better our school for the students as well as for the community.

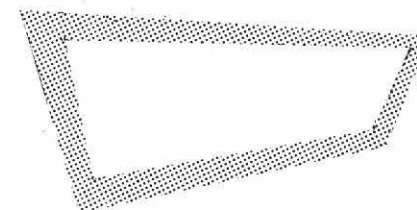
The Trojanette Club consists of girls pledged to promote interest in the field of sports by supporting their team in a positive manner, publicizing its activities and achievements, and helping at games.

Graduating losses of the Trojans will be light and the football team will be returning with the bulk of its team.

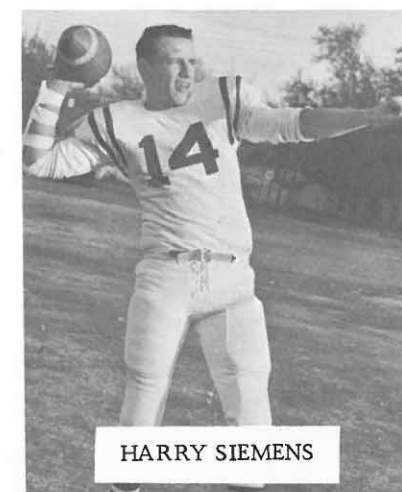

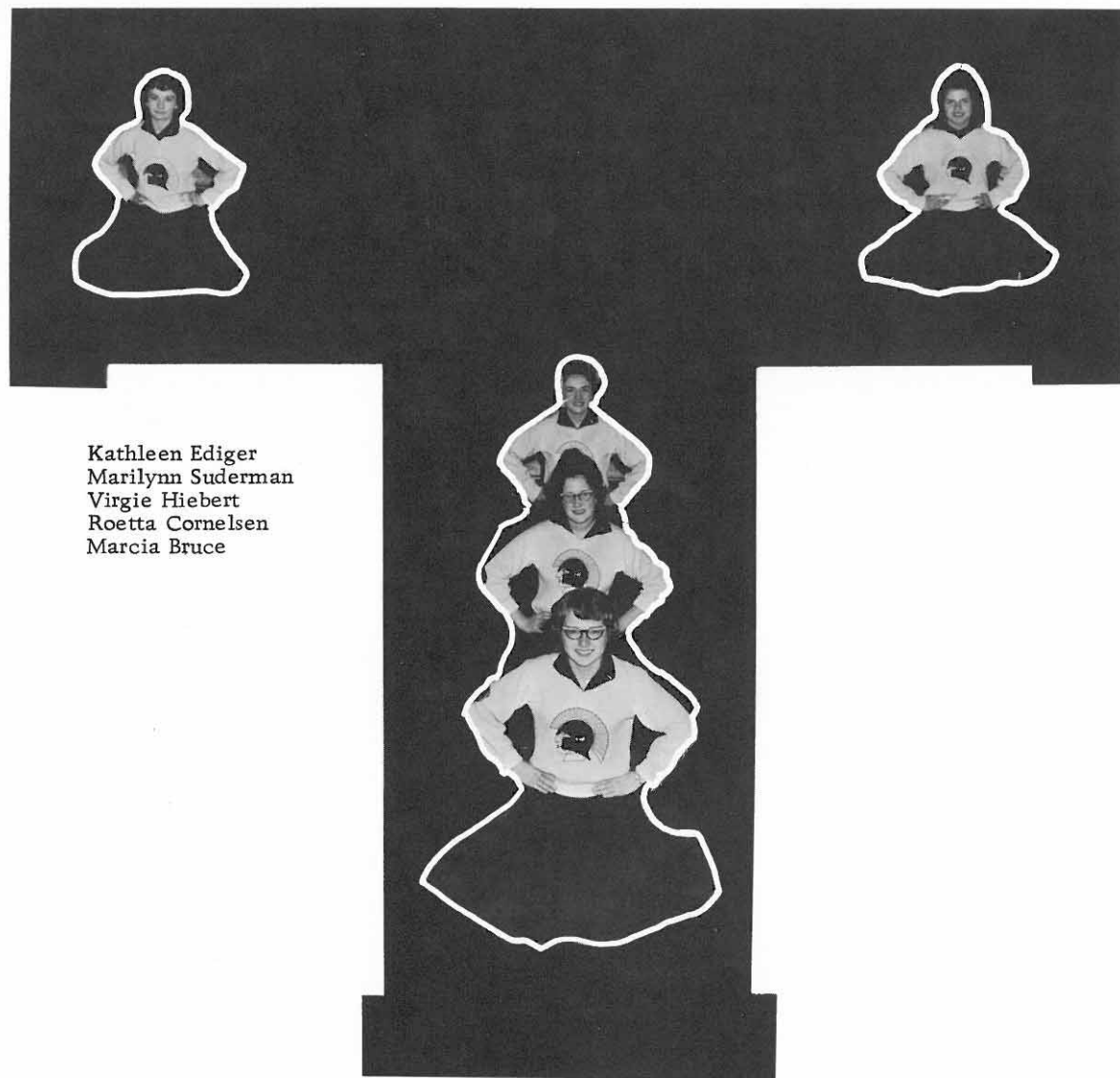
