## From the Home Office

After moving in 1993 from his late-night slot on NBC to an earlier slot on CBS, David Letterman became the undisputed king of late-night television. His Late Show annihilated Arsenio Hall, chased off Chevy Chase, neared Nightline, and trounced The Tonight Show in the ratings.

Letterman's late-night proficiency was vitally important to the faltering, third-ranked CBS. "I'm carrying this darn network!" he jokingly, iffrequently, pointed out during the Late Show.

The Late Show was very popular with Hillsboro High School students. "Dumb Guy", Larry "Bud" Melman, Dave's mom, the "Top Ten" list, and other Letterman skits were often a topic of conversation during morning classes. Whether ignoring Madonna's bad manners or getting fawned over by various actresses. Dave was the symbol of show business in the early 1990s.

His Top Tenlists, brought over to CBS from NBC, featured iabs at some famous (or infamous)

# Creating A Racket


Intensity, the drive to win, and hard work are what it takes to make a winning season, and that's exactly what this years girls tennis team was striving for.


Despite their efforts the season ended at regionals in Wichita, where the girls faced a strong Collegiate squad.





Coaches Corey Burton and Jeff Breit started with the fundamentals, but soon wrestlers were competing with advanced moves--and winning.





## Another Banner on the Wall

State Championship 1995

As eighth graders, basketball players in the class of '95 watched the Hillsboro boys win a state championship. "We'll do that someday," they promised.

At the end of 1994, the Trojan boys lost their sub-state semi-final game to Beloit by over 40 points. Just over a year later, the squad overcame incredible odds to win the 3A state championship game against Belleville.

What happened between those two games? The starters gained experience, the bench deepened, and several Trojan standouts learned to place the team's priorities ahead of their own.

Hillsboro lost several games early in the season--after 20 games, the team had lost five games by a total of ten points.

But in sub-state, the Trojans began to realize their potential. HHS began sub-state against MCAA rival Lyons. In sub-state finals, the boys, behind Brent Kyle, soundly beat a tough Sterling team with smart play and a tough defensive effort.

During state action, Hillsboro's basketball fever hit a new high. The Trojans showed their heart and determination with tough wins against Riverton and Immaculata.

In the state championship game, HHS faced Belleville, the team that knocked off Beloit. "Belleville is a different team now," some observers warned. But so were the Trojans. And Hillsboro, aided by huge fan support, won that game, and the state title, by making clutch free throws that were not made early in the season.

The HHS boys returned to Hillsboro as conquering heroes. The senior boys fulfilled their promise to win a state championship. Center Brent Kyle was named first-team all-3A. Eric Clark, Andy Kleiber, and Jeff Kreutziger received many awards. And the Hillsboro Trojans hung another banner on the wall.

Greenhaw took first place in Hillsboro's only home tournament, beating tough competition from Collegiate and Hesston. At the Marion tournament, Greenhaw and Frenzen took first and second, the 2-man team took first, and the 4man team took third.

Later in the season, though, the team did not perform as well. At regionals in Herington, no golfer scored as well as he did in the first meet of the year. 79 was the score needed to take an individual to state, but Hillsboro came up just short. The impressive season ended on a sour note.

Harlow Robert Brundage September 4, 1975-October 28, 1994

On October 28, 1994, Harlow Brundage finally succumbed to leukemia. He had undergone chemotherapy, surgery, and blood transfusions, fighting the disease for almost two years. Such resilience characterized Harlow's short, 19-year life; his inner strength was always apparent to those he met.

From Peabody, Kansas, Harlow is remembered by friends and teachers as a quiet, kind, unshakeable young man, someone who faced much adversity but never let his pain show. "He was always positive, a terrific example," explained teacher Dianne Myers. "He never gave up, even when he was in incredible pain."

Harlow loved to fish. "He always told fishing stories at lunch," recalled pal Mickey Smith. Harlow also enjoyed driving a dune buggy, which he received for his birthday. In school, Harlow was involved in Future Farmers of America, and enjoyed small animal science.

Harlow had begun a job at a Peabody supermarket when he was first diagnosed with cancer. He wanted, above all else, to graduate in 1995, but his condition never stabilized enough for the bone marrow transplant that he needed so badly.

Harlow Brundage always went about his business with his head held high. He was known to accept his problems in stride and focus on the positive side of life. "If he was having problems, he was tough; he seemed to think, 'I know who I am, and that's what matters,' " said Kelly Nuss.

Against insurmountable odds, Harlow exemplified strength and courage, never backing down or letting go. "He made me realize how insignificant my own problems were," explained Tina Clement.

That courage is how Harlow Robert Brundage will be remembered.





Robert C. Brown January 22, 1930-October 28, 1994

Robert Calvin Brown was born on January 22, 1930, in Cheney, Kansas. A native Kansan, he spent most of his life working at school districts in Marion County. After a lifetime of school service, he passed away on October 28, 1994, a victim of lymphatic cancer at the age of 64.

Brown, who spent time in the Air Force, was in the Air National Guard and flew regularly. He was superintendent of Florence before it unified with Marion; he was superintendent of Centre; and he finished his career as superintendent of Hillsboro High School.


During Brown's tenure as superintendent of United School District 410, he advocated and successfully built several major projects at Hillsboro High School. Under Brown, HHS added the commons, the outstanding new gym, the fine arts center, and the Wiebe Media Center.

Brown was a strong, principled, determined man who worked tirelessly to improve the district. "He always believed that his role was to put good teachers in the classroom and let them teach," recalled subsequent superintendent Gordon Mohn.

He was strong until the end. "His attitude was, 'I'm gonna beat this cancer,' " added Mohn. "He had a strong spirit." Amazingly, Brown worked as superintendent of HHS for nearly two years after his diagnosis. He sometimes would go to work immediately after a chemotherapy treatment. But his health failed him, and he was forced to retire.

Brown passed away in Riverside, California, a year after his retirement. "It's sad that he never had a chance to enjoy his retirement years," said Mohn.

The new gym, which he had such a major role in building, has since been dedicated "The Robert C. Brown Gymnasium."


