









Unfortunately, while Coryea placed fourth at the Regional Tournament in Douglass, his season ended without placing at state.


"Coryea did a great job," head coach Corey Burton said. "His first state match was against the state champion and he didn't get pinned. He lasted the entire three periods."





The 1996 Girls 3A State Champions. The Lady Trojans finished the season with a record of 24-2.




BRONZE STRINGS

But, the vacant positions were filled with the play of Perry, Hagen, Christiansen, Ratzlaff, and Plenert. The team formed a determined unit that silenced the pre-season critics by reeling off 11 straight wins including the Trojan Classic championship. The Trojans continued the rampage after a mid-season wake-up call and went on to take the league title, finishing the regular season with a record of 19-1. Hillsboro fought their way through a rugged sub-state to attempt to defend the 3A state crown. The road ended painfully with a loss to Collegiate and friends to leave the team with a disappointing third place finish.









School funding is a hot item in the State Senate and House of Representatives. Legislators were split over how to fund the school districts statewide. On a vote of 73-49, the House passed a plan crafted by the Senate to renew the 35-mill school property tax levy. The bill also will add \$22 per student, raising the per-pupil base to \$3,648 for the 304 local school districts.





Members of the Reform Party, associated with the 1992 presidential candidate Ross Perot, filed petitions June 3 to get their party on the November ballot in Kansas. They needed to submit 16,417 signatures; they turned in over 27,000.

Kansas Governor Bill Graves signs into law a bill to allow speed limits of 70 mph on interstate and 65 mph on two-lane improved roads. The Department of Transportation Secretary still had the authority to keep county roads and some state roads at the old speed of 55 mph. County highways remain at 55 mph, but county commissions could raise them to 65. The controversial part of the bill was the 10 mph buffer; speeders would not have the violation show on their record and insurance companies could not increase premiums. Kansas speed limits were reduced in 1974 from 75 mph during the daytime and 70 mph at night on interstates; on two-lane highways the speed was 70 mph during the day and 60 mph at night. Trucks were 60 mph on all highways. This was done to conserve gasoline.


Fort Hays State University Tiger basketball team finishes a perfect season with a record of 34-0. This is the third time in the history of the NCAA (and the first time for Division II) that a team has had a perfect record. They won the NCAA Division II championship playoff in Louisville over Northern Kentucky, 70-63. Tiger Head Coach Gary Garner was named Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.



High School All-American De Angelo Evans, from the Wichita Collegiate High School football team, broke all of the Kansas high school rushing records. Evans had 799 carries for 8,472 yards and a total of 131 TDs. Jersey #20 was retired February 23, 1996.



Playing for only 17 minutes in a 32-minute game, junior basketball point guard Jackie Stiles from Ciaffin High School scored 61 points in a 122-24 win over Ots-Bison. This score broke the state individual-game scoring record set in 1977.



Named Senior Wrestler of the Year in his division, senior Bill Gabel of St. Francis High School became Kansas' first four-time Division 3-2-1A champion. Undefeated during his junior and senior seasons, his career record of 125-5 had 382 takedowns.



Josh Reid, senior for the Brewster Bulldogs, broke three state records in the final game of his high school career. He was the state's all-time leading scorer with 2,554 career points. Scoring 47 points in his final game, he broke the record set in 1965 for the most points in a tournament game.
