REPORTS

Brian Jackson, Superintendent

Mr. Jackson commended the Administration for their work since March. It was a team effort. They pulled things together quickly, made plan after plan and he wanted to recognize their work and let them know how much he appreciated it.

Jessica Bissett, Business Manager

She reported that she is continuing to work on the budget for the 2020-2021 school year and still finalizing the 2019-2020 fiscal year and preparing for the audit in the fall. All accounts are budgeted as of May 2020.

Eric Gaydos, Academic Director

Mr. Gaydos announced that the West Greene School District has been awarded a \$50,000 grant for "Reimaging STEAM Education in a Rural School District." He thanked Melissa Ullom, Karlie Wright, Tim Barnes, Brian Jackson, The Community Foundation of Greene County and the EQT Foundation's Ellen Ross. West Greene is now a Project Lead the Way School District, due to a \$30,000 competitive grant from Chevron. Mrs. Hildreth will be spearheading the change in curriculum. The PLTW Gateway Curriculum will cover specific courses for 7th and 8th Grade students over the next two years. The PLTW will be expanded into the high school in the coming years. This fits perfectly with the new STEM/STEAM renovation. Twelve students enrolled in the Case Western Reserve Reading and Writing Summer Program. The PDE released guidance regarding the reopening plan of schools with three different opening scenarios: Traditional, Google Classroom Cyber or hybrid of both. The West Greene Administration is working towards developing an informational packet for all families. The District's Health and Safety Plan has been established.

Jared Edgreen, School Police Officer

Builders Hardware is currently installing new hallway, cafeteria and Junior High Gym doors to meet the best practices for safety and security. He completed continuing education classes prescribed for School Police Officers through the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission. He and the Administration have received training from Siemens on the new security system that will be going "live" soon. He has compiled the 2019-2020 Act 44 Safety and Security Board Report.

Scott Sakai, Junior-Senior High School Principal

Mr. Sakai has been working with Mrs. Garlick and Mrs. Fedak to finalize Prom Planning at Lakeview Resort in Morgantown, WV. Attendees must purchase a ticket at \$40 per person. Monitoring will continue for both Pennsylvania and West Virginia for COVID-19 guidelines and restrictions. The West Greene FFA will be holding their end of year banquet on June 30, 2020 at 6:30 PM at Valley View Farms. The venue will be following all state guidelines for COVID-19. He thanked Mrs. Wright and the FFA members for all of their efforts in planning this event. He thanked everyone who assisted in the planning and execution of the 2020 Commencement Ceremony. A special experience was able to be provided for the Seniors.

Bob Ward, Director of Educational and Informational Technology

The District will be moving to a 1:1 environment for the students. The equipment has begun to come in and is being staged in the technology area. The Wilson Group (LCD interactive displays) should have installation completed before the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year. A plan is being devised for the dissemination of the equipment for the students.

Don Painter, Elementary Principal,

There are 39 students registered for Kindergarten, screenings are scheduled for July 1. After registration, there will be a recognition for the Kindergarten students at staggered time, beginning at 1:00 PM.

Jim Elesenheimer, Director of Food Service

Food deliveries are continuing to the remote sites on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Approximately 60 - 70 students are being served at Junior-Senior High School location. At Wind Ridge and Graysville a combined total of 20 - 30. New Freeport is 60 - 65.

John McDermitt, Director of Facilities

The logging is 99 percent complete. The flag pole is up in the football field. The waterproofing project in the electric room began last week. The sanitation at the Elementary Center is almost completed. Thirty-five dispenser stations have been installed and 90,000 masks have been ordered.

Bill Simms, Athletic Director

Physicals were performed in the Nurse's Office on June 11, and 15. He thanked Laura Miller and Ginger Wise for assisting in the process. At the same time he tried distributing athletic award pins and certificates. He thanked John McDermitt, Sam Milliken and Brian Ross for beginning work on the temporary football practice field area. Equipment and sleds have been moved up to that area.

Greene County Career and WGEA Representative, Jan Berdine

Ms. Berdine reported that Brian Jackson is now the Superintendent on Record for the CTC for the next two years.

PSBA Liaison, Michael Hildreth

House Bill 2438 which deals with providing broadband infrastructure to under-served, rural areas passed the House and will allow electrical operatives to use their existing poles to deploy fiber lines with broadband. Some easements held by electric cooperatives do not permit them to attach fiber lines to those poles even though the members want this service. Legislation will allow electric cooperatives to use their existing infrastructure to help expand broadband access to rural Pennsylvania.

HEARING OF CITIZENS

Buzz Walters, Center Township - Crouse's School House belongs to the Historical Society and they are choosing to give it up. The building would revert back to the family. He asked if the School District would consider taking over that piece of history. It is one of the founding schools of the West Greene School District. Mr. Scott indicated that if they could find a way to integrate it into the curriculum, that would provide a reason for obtaining the structure. The upkeep would need to be taken into consideration.
