

PK-5 E- Learning Q & A

All teachers in grades PK-5 have prepared packets that can be used when an e-learning day is implemented. This allows us to be prepared regardless of the day or notice given. The intention of this plan is to allow us flexibility and adapt these procedures as we learn from what works best. We also realize there is not a one size fits all plan and our intent is to keep students learning through a few modes of delivery in this adventurous North Dakota winter weather.

How does the packet system work?

How will I communicate with my child's teacher?

Preschool – 5th grade teachers will utilize Remind App as the tool to alert you of e-learning day expectations. You can respond privately to these messages. Teachers may also be reached via email.

Why so many packets and colors?

The packets every two-weeks is our attempt to keep the learning standards relevant to concepts being currently taught.

What does packets and/or Chromebooks mean for elementary?

Preschool & Kindergarten will exclusively utilize packets to complete e-learning.

1st & 2nd Grade: Will primarily use packets. They will also provide online suggestions for extra practice; these will however be suggestions not expectations.

3rd – 5th Grade: Will provide packets for days we can't provide devices in advance. However, if a storm is predicated, we may send Chromebooks home as well to allow for more opportunity to keep the learning relevant to current classroom standards and concepts. Also providing a more consistent delivery of what a normal day in class may look like.

What if we have a multi-day storm?

In event of a multi-day storm, we may need to adjust weeks, but this is a general idea for the packet distribution. Once the packet is completed, we will issue a new packet. We understand that many situations can arise, and we will do our best to anticipate and adjust to keep learning meaningful and purposeful.

Where are username and passwords for apps and Chromebook?

Each teacher will provide students with a list of their usernames and passwords for applications or to access their Chromebook. Most teachers will provide these in their take-home folders or planners.

What does a typical e-learning day look like?

An e-learning day should be a few hours of review concepts to keep our brains fresh. Teachers will provide packets or online learning opportunities to make this happen. Our intentions are for this to be practice that makes us think but is not to stressful, just do your best. We also know that learning can happen anywhere so if your baking, playing cards, helping shovel, you are learning, and we love it!
