## I've heard rumors our logo can't be used anymore, is this true?

Yes, that is true. I received a letter in the mail from the Wyoming Secretary of State's Office informing the district that we are not allowed to use the bucking horse logo as our official logo. The bucking horse image is a Federally Trademarked Image and they have asked all schools that are using it to change their logo.

I tried everything I could to keep the logo, but we are going to have to modify it. We can still be called the Cowboys, but we can't use Wyoming's specific bucking horse image. The image to the right is an example of a bucking horse that is acceptable to the state of Wyoming, and we have started to use it on our website. This has not become our formal logo, but it is one that we have chosen to use while we work on creating an official logo moving forward.


## How do we move forward from here?

The process moving forward will be to have students, patrons and or alumni submit designs that they think would represent our district. The board of education will narrow the suggestions down and then have the public vote on what they would like moving forward. The submissions do not need to be professional renderings. If the winner is a kindergarten student, then we would have a professional artist take their design and make it professionally appropriate.

## What do we do about the gym floor: the logo is center court?

This is another great question. Even though the state of Wyoming is informing us that we can't use the logo, they are not dropping the hammer and expecting us to change things all at once. They realize that it is going to take some time to transition. Some items they have asked to be changed immediately would be things such as letter head or t -shirt sales. For other large items, like the gym floor, they have given us up to 15 years to phase out the trademarked design.

Even though this is frustrating and disappointing news, the tradition of excellence will remain at CodyKilgore, and we will continue to be the Cody-Kilgore Cowboys.

Please be on the lookout for a submission date for new logo ideas. Even though the traditional logo that we all know and love is going away, it's also exciting to think that one of your ideas might be used for the rest of CKUS history.
