Parents and Eden Community,

Eden CISD has been notified that an employee who works for Eden CISD has tested positive for COVID-19. Due to privacy requirements, we will not release the name of the individual or details that may identify him or her. After a case investigation with the Department of Health and Human Services, individuals who may have come into contact have been notified.

Eden CISD has been deeply sanitized and all District employees and students are instructed to continue to follow CDC guidelines and recommendations and to practice social distancing.

Based on the information that we have gathered, it has been determined that the end of the 14-day incubation period for anyone possibly exposed on campus to the employee is November 16.

Out of an abundance of caution, we advise you to monitor your health, follow the [CDC guidelines for people who have had close contact](#) and contact your primary care physician if you develop symptoms. Any of the following symptoms indicate a possible COVID-19 infection:

- Temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth;
- Sore throat;
- New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (or, for students with a chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline);
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain; or
- New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever.

Eden CISD is continuing to monitor this situation and will provide additional information as needed. We hope for a successful recovery for our staff member.
