FY23 Estimates

Many assumptions are used when the district is building their budget in December and January for the following school and fiscal year. State Education Aid is one of the most significant.

Generally, the only available estimate for State Education Aid during the timeframe we begin to build our annual budget is RIDE's data submitted to the Governor's office in preparation for the Governor's budget request.

For FY23, the Governor's Budget included \$10,056,083 of State Education Aid for the Barrington Public Schools.

Public estimates of State Aid remained unchanged until we were notified on June 10, 2022 (after Barrington and most other municipalities in the state had adopted their FY23 budgets) that another amount (and calculation methodology) was under consideration for State Education Aid by the House Finance Committee.



This new allocation resulted in \$1.5M less than the Governor's recommended amount for Barrington. The Barrington decrease occurred despite additional funding of over \$21M to State Education Aid funding overall from House Finance. Three communities saw decreases from the Governor's proposal and 36 saw increases.

The reason Barrington (and two other communities) saw a decrease in State Education Aid despite the overall increase was because House Finance also changed the way it allocated funds via the state funding formula.



The Governor's FY23 proposal used the most recent state share ratio (or the amount of education funding that the State should contribute to each municipality). Barrington's state share ratio for FY23 is 25.6%. This increase was notable as the second highest increase in the state from our FY22 ratio (21.4%).

Per State Law, the State Division of Municipal Finance submits the data used to calculate the state share ratio to RIDE each year. This data consists of assessed property values adjusted for median family income.

Monitor FY23 spending

Use of fund balance (revision of policy may be necessary to cover revenue shortfalls). The current fund balance (as of 7/1/2022) is \$1,195,721

Encourage improved State communication with LEA's of potential revisions to State Education Aid, ideally earlier in the budget process than this year

Continue to pursue supplemental state funding to hold Barrington harmless for the methodology used for the FY23 calculation
