On 8/10/2016, the Kern County Superintendent of Schools Office determined that Buttonwillow Union School District's LCAP met all of the criteria outlined in Education Code 52070. - The district clearly identified all expenditures using the California School Accounting Manual (CSAM) classifications.
- The district's identified needs were clearly defined and included a description of the supporting data used to identify the need.
- Changes to goals, actions, services or expenditures are clearly explained in the annual update.

#### Recommendations:

- It is recommended that the district provide clearly defined baselines for all required state metrics.
- It is recommended that the district use formative assessments/data (local measures) to enhance the monitoring of progress towards goals.

## Strength:

• Budgeted expenditures are clearly described and enumerated.

#### Recommendation:

• It is recommended that the district strengthen the description of district and/or school-site services and how such services are principally directed towards and effective in meeting the goals for unduplicated pupils.

## **DISTRICT PROGRESS**

The district has made progress in the following goal areas:

Goal 1: Increase student achievement - EL students making progress toward English proficiency (AMAO1)- 2.8% increase to 56.2%; Students achieving English proficiency. (AMAO2-less than 5yrs) -1.9% increase to 25.5%; (AMAO2-more than 5 yrs.)- 9.8% increase to 38.6%.

The district has made progress in the following state metrics:

Priority 5: Pupil Engagement - Chronic absenteeism rate decreased from 15.27% to .05%
