III. Capital Projects

- Growth projections for the next 10 years in South Bryan are 4.5% and 1% in North Bryan. In the next 10 years, Bryan County School District will grow by approximately 3,562 new students. Long range planning considerations include looking at phasing out buildings versus updating the current buildings.
- Samples of 5 different options for long range planning were presented 3 for
 South Bryan and 2 for North Bryan. These included the following:
 - South Cluster Option 1 a new 3,000 student Richmond Hill High school on the same site, a new elementary school, a new middle school, and a South Bryan Operations Center for transportation, maintenance, and technology. Projected cost - 139.15 million.
 - South Cluster Option 2 a new 3,000 student Richmond Hill High school on a new site, a new elementary school, a new middle school

- on existing RHHS site, and a South Bryan Operations Center for transportation, maintenance, and technology. Projected cost 120.9 million.
- South Cluster Option 3 a new 2,500 student Richmond Hill High school on a new site, a new high school on existing RHHS site, a new elementary school, a new middle school, and a South Bryan Operations Center for transportation, maintenance, and technology. Projected cost - 155.92 million.
- North Cluster Option 1 a new 800 student middle school on existing site, a new 1,000 student high school on existing site, an addition to BCES, Central office expansion on existing site, and a North Bryan Operations Center for transportation, maintenance, and technology.
 Projected cost 51.99 million.
- o North Cluster Option 2 a new 800 student middle school on existing site, a new 1,000 student high school on existing site, an addition to BCES, Central office expansion on existing site, a new 800 student primary school, and a North Bryan Operations Center for transportation, maintenance, and technology. Projected cost 65.23 million.
