2015-16 Highlights

SSD launched a new website, mobile app, and Facebook page.

Students earned a record number of 211 qualifying AP scores.

SSD increased teacher salaries by \$1,500.

District was awarded a \$163,000 grant from the enhancing Missouri's Instructional Networked Teaching Strategies (eMINTS) National Center at the University of Missouri College of Education to purchase Chromebooks for every 7th grader during the 2016-17 school year.

SHS Cheerleaders and SHS Softball Team both won state championships.

Class of 2016 accepted a record total of \$4,774,896 in scholarships.

Alternative Learning Academy was named Alternative Education Model Program by Arkansas Department of Education.

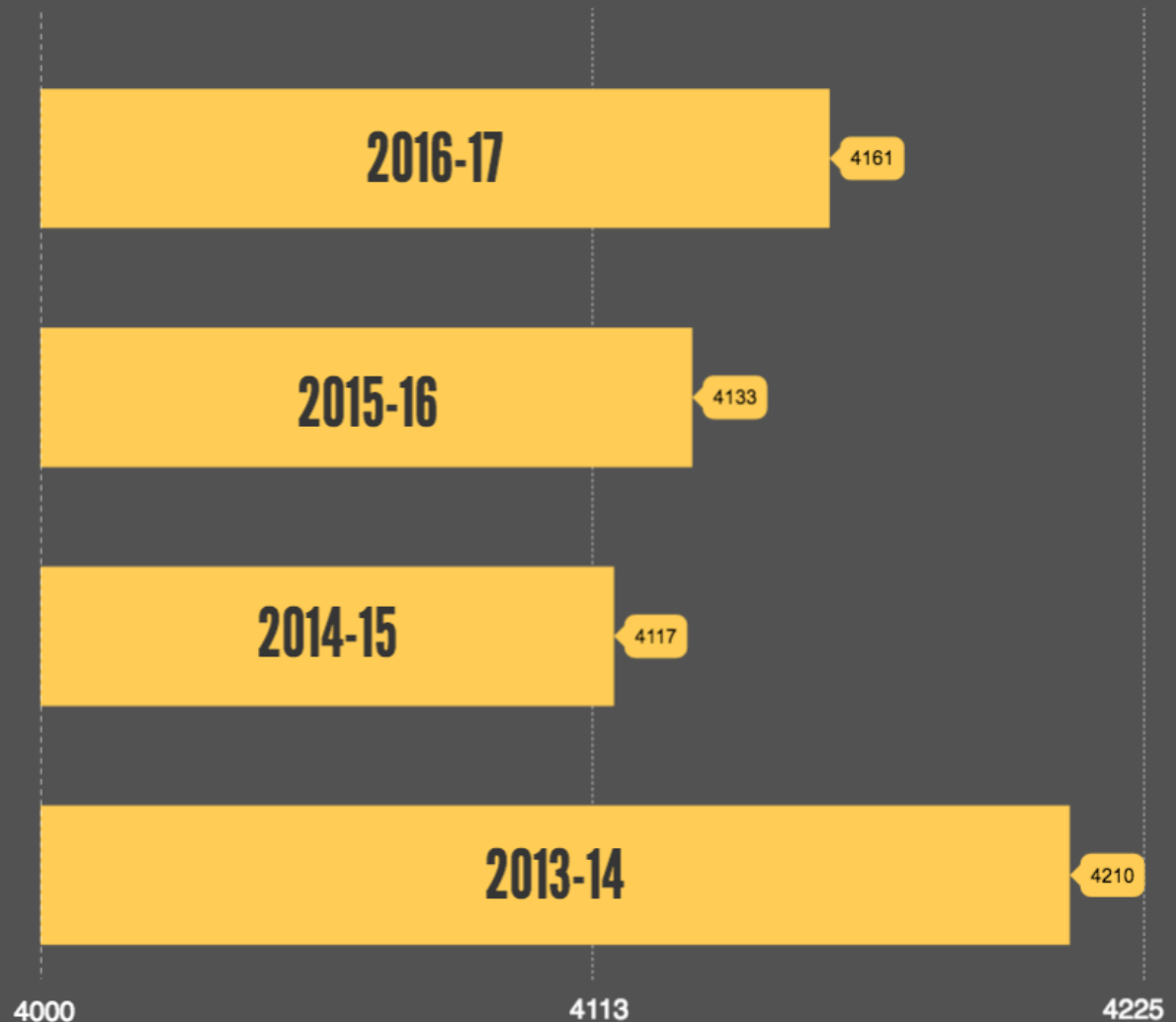

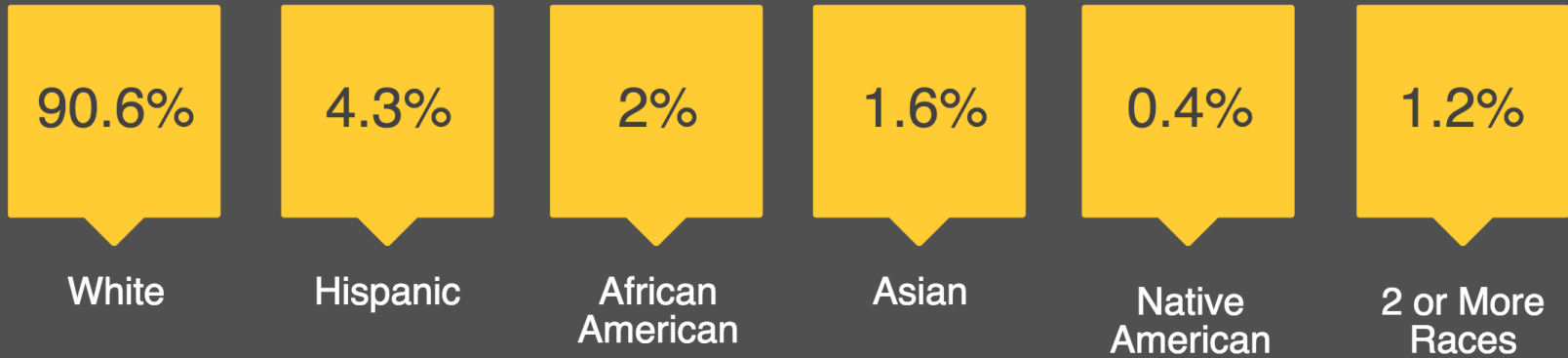

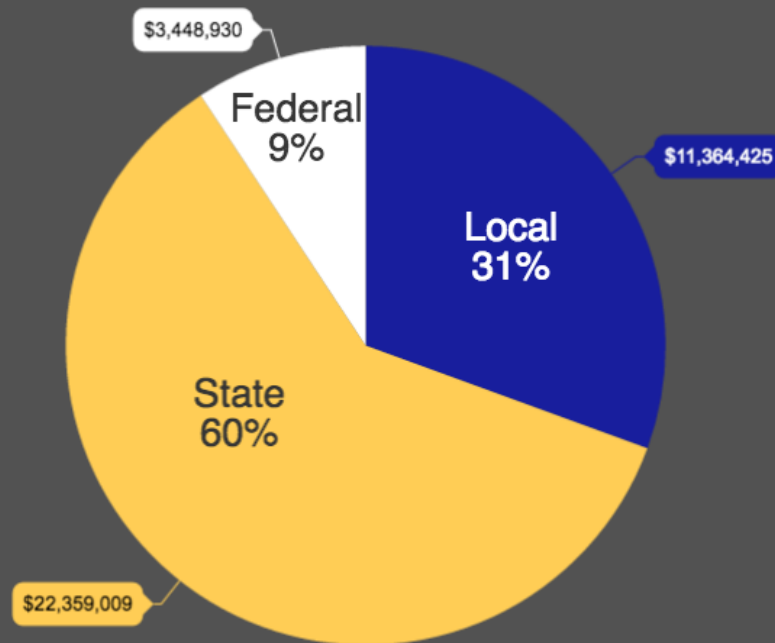

Grades K-2: Whole Group Enrichment

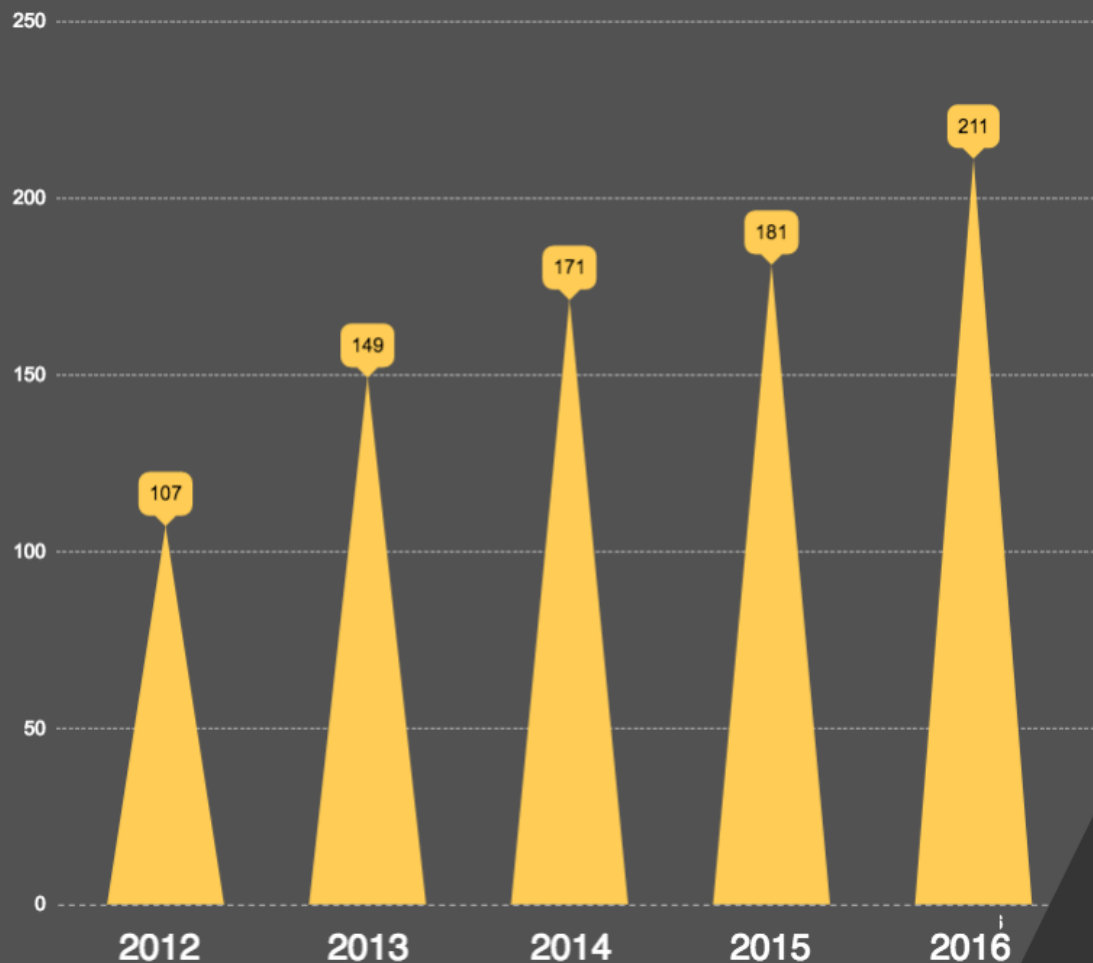

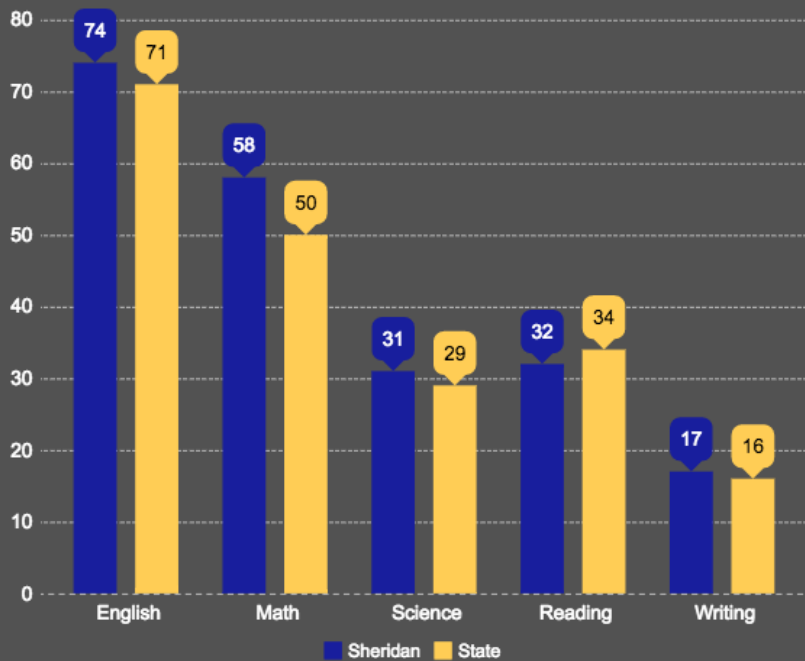

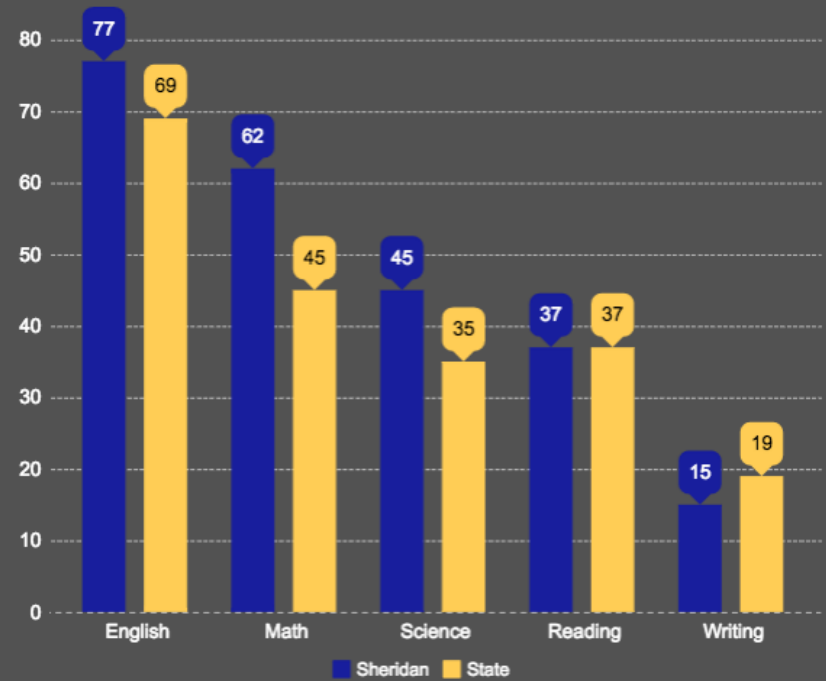

% of 3rd Graders Who Met Readiness Benchmarks

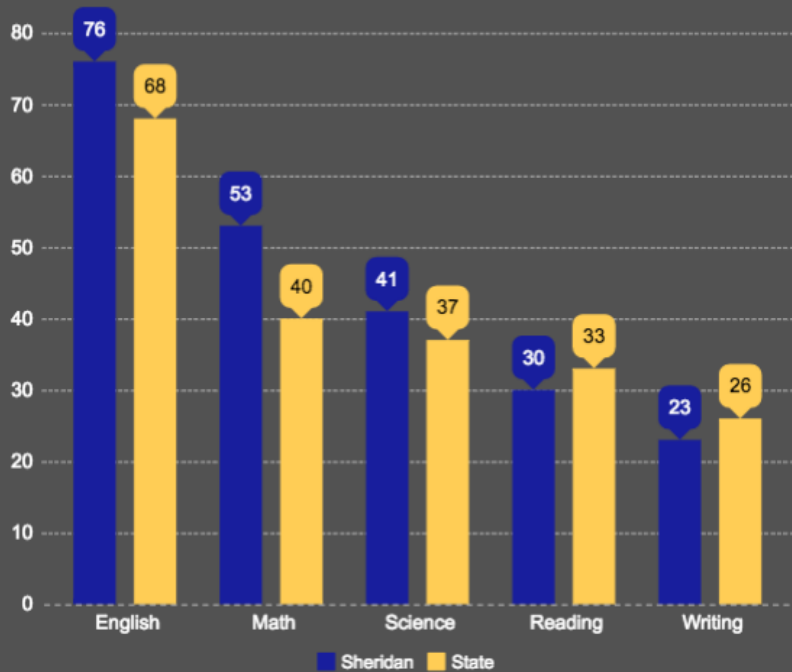


% of 4th Graders Who Met Readiness Benchmarks

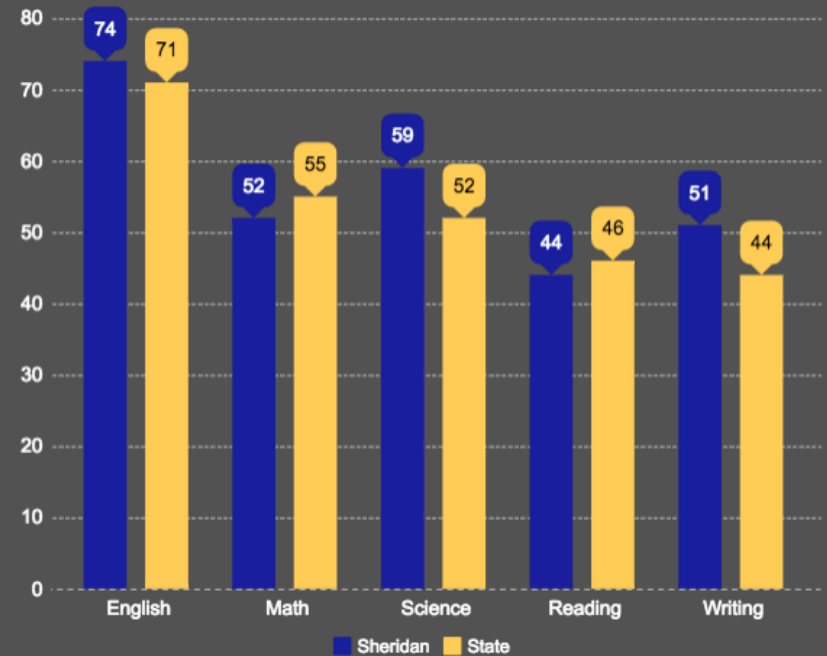


2016 ACT Aspire 5th & 6th Grade

% of 5th Graders Who Met Readiness Benchmarks

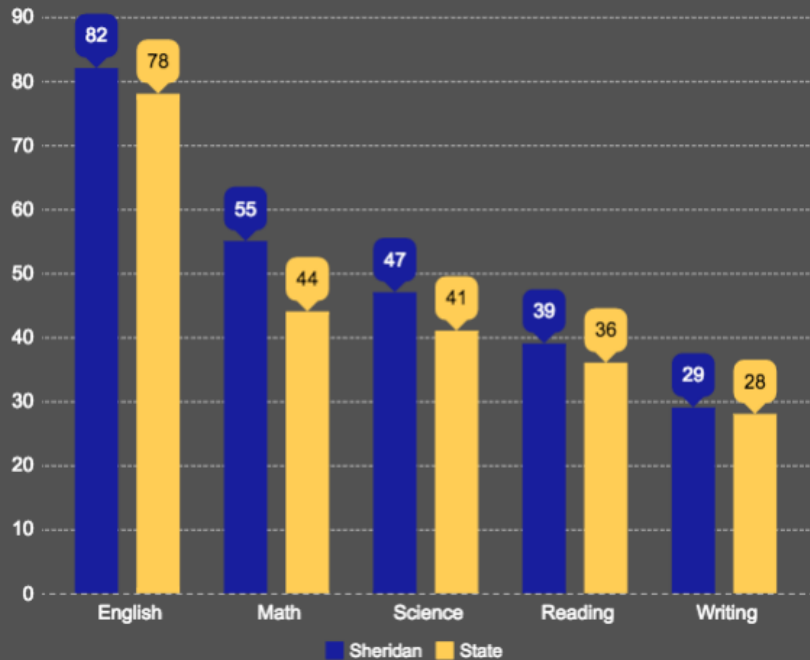


% of 6th Graders Who Met Readiness Benchmarks

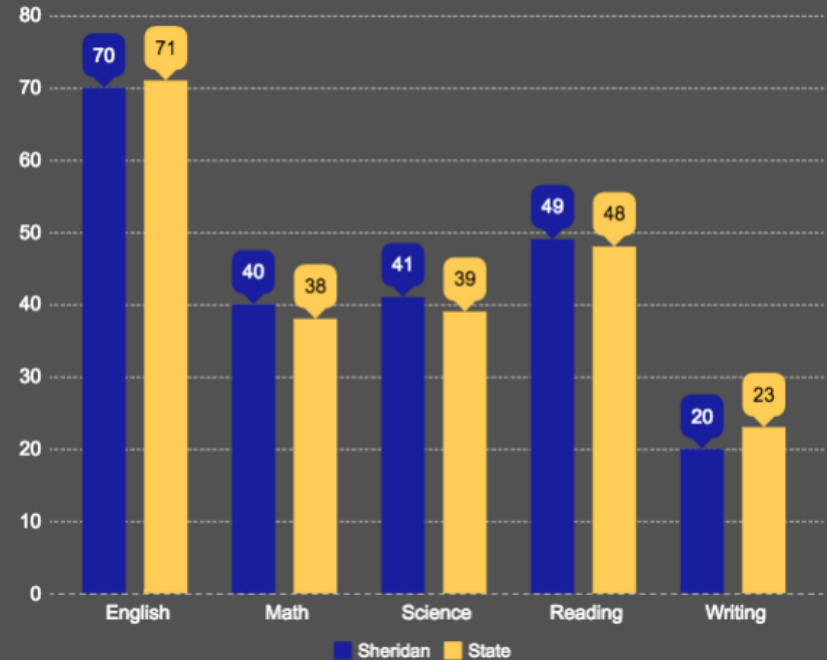


2016 ACT Aspire 7th & 8th Grade

% of 7th Graders Who Met Readiness Benchmarks

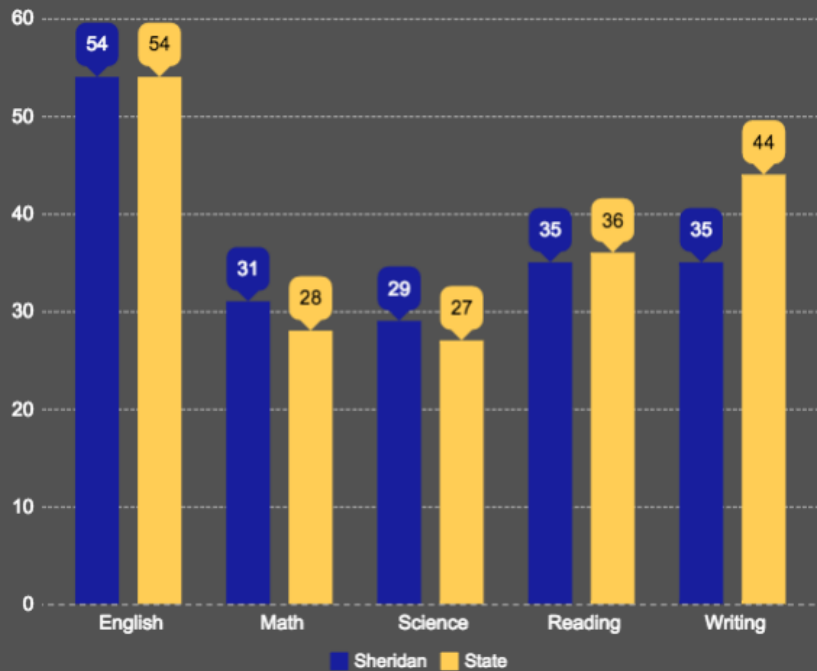


% of 8th Graders Who Met Readiness Benchmarks

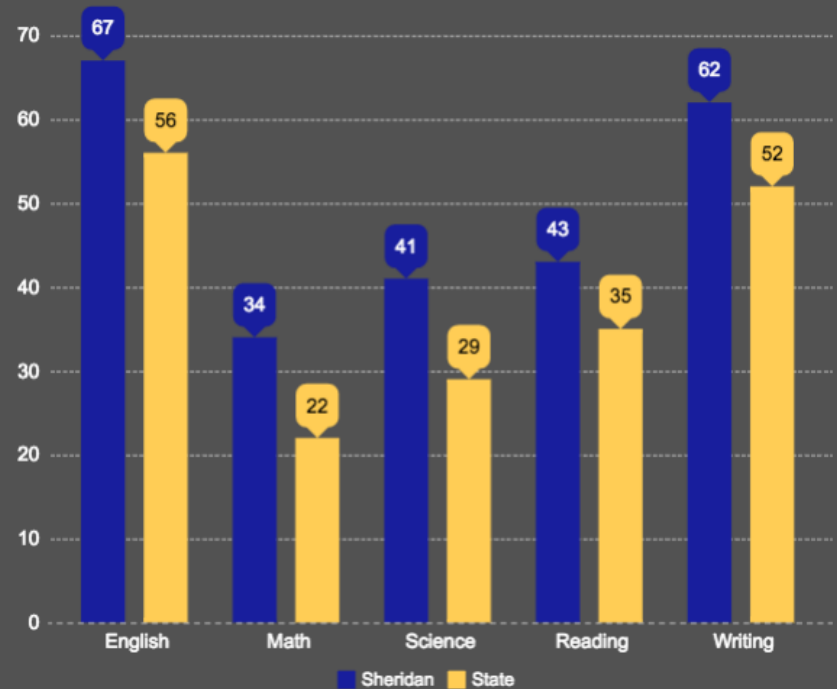


2016 ACT Aspire 9th & 10th Grade

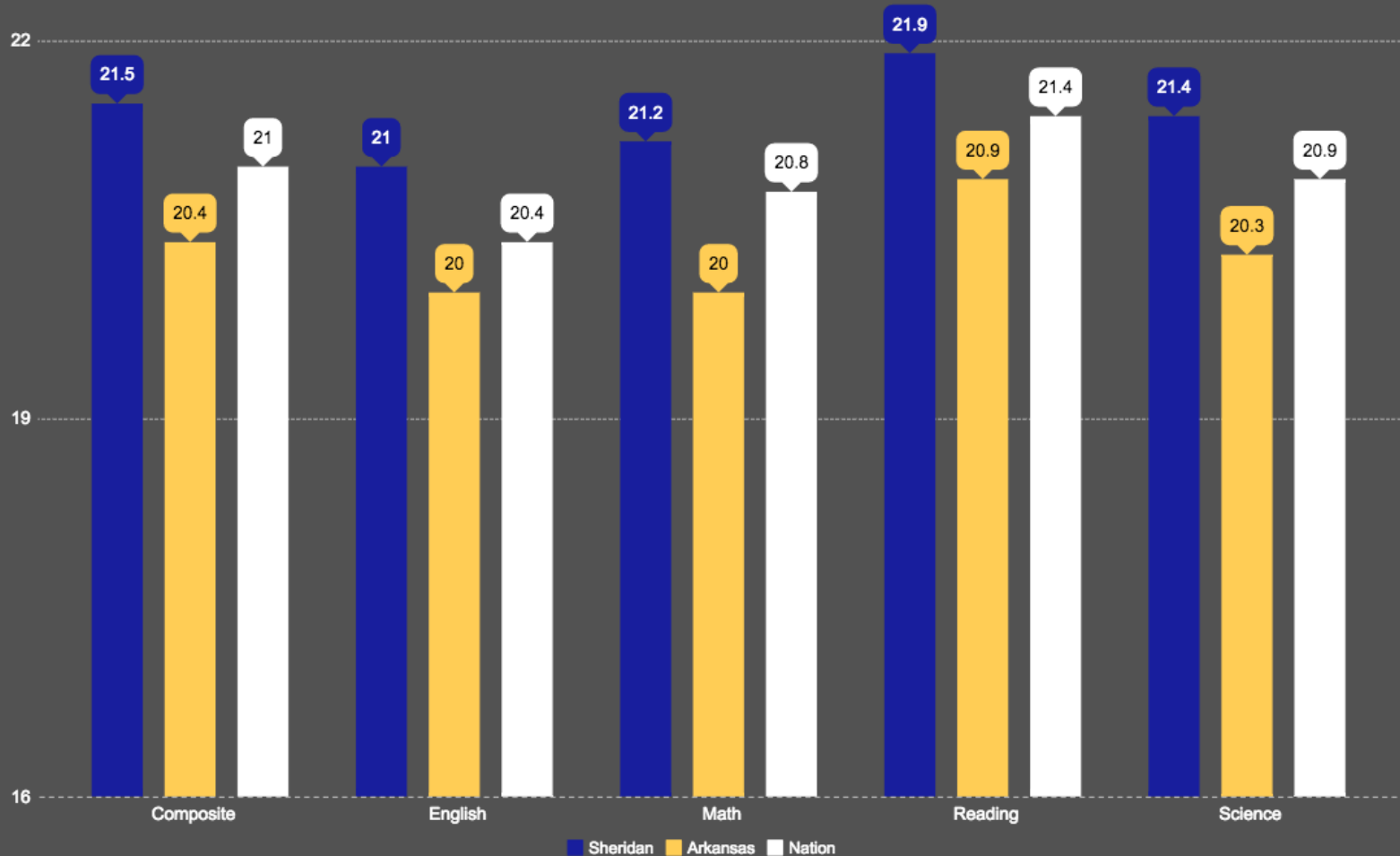
% of 9th Graders Who Met Readiness Benchmarks
