A. Student Achievement Data

Mena Middle School took the ACT Aspire Test during the spring of 2015.

B. School Programs / Process Data

Mena Middle School teachers were surveyed in September 2016 to evaluate current funding to meet the needs of educationally disadvantaged students. Survey results revealed Turn It In and Lit Lab are no longer needed because the literacy department purchased textbooks with a similar Literacy Program. Student achievement data in the area of Writing and Reading supported the purchase of the new Literacy Program by Mena Middle School. All other polled items are being utilized by departments and require funding to meet the needs of educationally disadvantaged students.

C. Perception Data

Mena Middle School completed a School Perception survey during the 2016-2017 student registration. Survey results revealed the parents/guardians had a low perception of the following statement:

"My child has at least one adult advocate in the school."

Mena Middle School plans to change this perception by increasing communication to parents/guardians about our low student-teacher ratio TEAM class. TEAM is an acronym for Together Everyone Achieves More. TEAM is a twenty minute daily class with the purpose of students checking grades, doing homework, conferencing with teachers, and doing team building activities with their TEAM teacher. This teacher is their assigned advocate in the school in addition to their classroom teachers, counselor, assistant principal, and principal.

Mena Middle School plans to increase parent/guardian awareness by mailing postcards each nine weeks reminding parents/guardians about the TEAM class with their child's teacher/adult advocate at Mena Middle School.

Mena Middle School plans to conduct a post survey during the second semester to review parent/guardian perception of the following statement:

In the Spring semester the Holly Harshman Elementary School students in the fifth grade tour the Mena Middle School facilities prior to entering sixth grade. A Spring Fling Festival is conducted in May for fifth grade students and their parent or guardian to meet the sixth grade teachers. Career Action Planning conferences are held in the second semester for seventh and eighth grade students and their parent or guardian. All incoming or outgoing students throughout the school year meet with the counselor for schedule planning and school orientation.

Coordination of Programs

The Mena Middle School plan coordinates with federal, state, and local services through the cafeteria for nutrition. MMS uses a local mental health provider, Western Arkansas Counseling and Guidance Center, to work with students, teachers, and counselors. School counselors work with area agencies to identify students who are part of the homeless population and the district has set aside \$4,000 to assist with school supplies and clothing needs for those students. We coordinate with the Polk County Health Department to assist students with immunizations. Additional school partnerships are Department of Human Services, Polk County Juvenile Court System, River Valley Regional Food Bank, Wal-Mart, Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, and the University of Arkansas Extension Service.

Mena Middle School offers several opportunities for students to begin preparing for their college preparation and future career. These classes are Career Tech Education, Family Consumer Science Investigation, Introduction to Computers and Keyboarding, Introduction to Agriculture, Leadership and Service Learning, and Tools for Learning. The MMS partnership with Rich Mountain Community College, the Career Action Planning Conferences, and the Sixth Grade Careers of Mena Field Trip contribute to career preparation for students.

Mena Middle School has a Parent Involvement Committee, a Homeless Plan, tracks migrants, and identifies LEP students for language barriers. Homeless students are identified for services in order to be given an equal education opportunity. Common Core Curriculum is utilized to prepare students to be ready for college and careers. MMS has an ongoing bullying program and a conflict resolution program. IDEA is met through self-contained and resource classes.
