Homebound Services

Students with medical conditions certified by a medical doctor which will require them to be absent from school four or more consecutive weeks may be eligible for Homebound Services. Through this program, the North Little Rock School district offers students the opportunity for uninterrupted instruction during their confinement and the opportunity to return to their classes up-to-date, working on the same chapter as students who never left.

While on Homebound, most students carry a full load and keep their same schedule of classes. If circumstances necessitate more than six weeks away from school, high school students may be asked to drop performance-based classes such as choir, drama, laboratory science, etc.

Homebound is not home schooling. It is not remedial education. And it is not a second chance to get caught up for students who have not been keeping up with their schoolwork. It is our attempt to transport school to a home setting for a limited amount of time while a student is unable to attend classes at school.

During the period of homebound instruction, the homebound teacher meets with each student 4 hours/week; returns completed work to school; assists student with schoolwork as needed; personally supervises all quizzes, tests, and semester exams; coordinates assignments with teachers at school; documents completion of work and homebound attendance.
