 "Good Evening—We continue to have the best recognitions ever! When we have a
 room full of students and staff who have accomplished so much in sports, the arts, and
 academics, it is the most rewarding feeling of all. I hope that you know how proud we
 are to see the Beacon full of pictures of these successes and promoting what Mid-Del
 is all about—excellence!

Teaching and Learning:

Dr. Phil Warrick was here last week leading "Coaching Classroom Instruction" with our Principals and Instructional Coaches. Great response to his instruction as they learned about the 5 Goals for Coaching Classroom Instruction: Point teachers toward best practices; Show teachers what good teaching looks like; Help teachers maintain their best performance; Help teachers achieve their "flow" of growth and change; and Help teachers take risks—to be creative, initiate something new, etc. Our Asst. Principals will train later this week as well.

Athletics:

Two basketball teams, MWC High School Lady Bombers and the CA Boys High School Titans teams go to Tulsa this week to the State Championships. We had several teams make it to the Area tournaments. We appreciate the efforts of the team, the coaches and the parents to make this year a success and we look forward to what the week holds for our two remaining teams.

The results for our high school wrestling teams are as follows: Midwest City High School placed 11th and Del City High School placed 13th in 6A. Carl Albert High School placed 21st in 5A. We had no individual champions.

Administrative:

The Midwest City Chamber's Youth Excel program selected two students to shadow with me these past two weeks for ½ day. Christopher Bates, Midwest City High

School, and Rachel Cook, Carl Albert High School, have been with me in Leadership meetings and tours of the district facilities. They both attended the Midwest City Rotary Club with me.

Mid-Del is proud to host a UCO Co-hort program starting this Fall for our staff who are interested in seeking their Master's degree. Some of our staff will teach the classes along with UCO professors teaching classes as well. We are excited about this opportunity to offer this program in the district for our prospective students. This will be our second time to offer this program in the district.

Snow days have continued to interrupt our school year these past two weeks. We have been out of school for five days this year. While we are okay in terms of the numbers of hours of instruction we are required to provide, the uncertainty of the weather and the predictions make the decision difficult to call.

Days built into the 2014-15 School Year remaining: We have 3.11 days left at Midwest City Elementary, 4.11 days left at the other Elementary sites, and 6.24 days remaining at both the Middle Schools and the High Schools as of March 10, 2015.

We do not have to make up these days.

March 30 Rally will occur before our next meeting. We will have an organizational meeting on Wednesday, March 25, at 4:30 p.m. in the Board Room. We look forward to a great Mid-Del turnout the afternoon of the Rally.

I attended the AASA meeting and learned that we share in the many trending and emerging topics discussed at the conference. In particular, sessions of most interest focused on Social Media—Its Pitfalls and Perks for students all the way to the Superintendent's Office. Too, topics including culture and climate within schools were prevalent in the conference as schools struggle with increasing poverty, discipline issues, bullying, social and racial issues, dropouts and lack of financial support. Of interest as well, were model programs for Principal and Teacher Leader Pathways. Digital Literacy and how school districts are changing their curriculum to enhance digital literacy—not just purchasing devices for use with popular programs.

We have all been concerned with the Digital Footprint that is left with every post, but now the term has changed to a Digital Tattoo that stays forever. The message was that we have the responsibility to communicate and teach our students that what they post follows them through their lives and careers. Employers are now going to the internet to search information on applicants before they even have a chance to present themselves to the employer...a new way to determine if they will even have an opportunity for an interview.

Legislatively, we have been following many education-related bills. Those of most concern are the ESA Voucher bill that passed the Senate today; the AP History Bill in its current form; the Board of Education term limits bill; and the lack of support for the

sustained financial support of schools and teacher salary proposal. These are desperate times for common education funding and support for teacher raises when the discussion has all but died...the very reason we must revive it with a strong showing at the March 30 Rally to bring it back to the forefront of the Legislative discussion BESIDES those bills that seek to take away financial support of schools.

XIII. Mr. Trent requested the Board discuss the compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) as a requirement for E-Rate applicants. Mr. Trent, with the Board's permission, read the following into the minutes as having met the CIPA requirements:

The Midwest City –Del City School District is in compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA).

We are using Cisco IronPort for our technology protection measure (Internet filtering software). Cisco IronPort protects against access by adults and minors to visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography, or - with respect to use of computers with Internet access by minors - harmful to minors. It may be disabled for adults engaged in bona fide research or other lawful purposes. Our district policy includes monitoring the online activities of minors.

Our Internet Safety Policy addresses the following as required by CIPA:

- a. access by minors to inappropriate matter on the Internet and World Wide Web;
- b. the safety and security of minors when using electronic mail, chat rooms, and other forms of direct electronic communications;
- unauthorized access, including so-called "hacking," and other unlawful activities by minors online;
- d. unauthorized disclosure, use, and dissemination of personal information regarding minors;

- e. measures designed to restrict minors' access to materials harmful to minors; and
- f. educating minors about appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking websites and in chat rooms and cyberbullying awareness and response.
