- Once again this year, our fifth graders had the opportunity to shadow a sixth grader for the day to see firsthand what their schedule will be like as a new middle school-er.
- Mrs. Greene and the STARS educators have collaborated on getting the school garden underway. A special thanks to Terry and Sydney O'Shaughnessy for their help!
- Grades K-8 science teachers recently attended an informational session on FOSS (Full Option Science System). We are hoping to fully implement this curriculum next school year.

DIRECTOR OF STUDENT SERVICES:

Mr. Munn offered:

• I want to take this opportunity to thank the Board of Education for your support of our students with special needs. Both of our students that have been identified by the CSE are on pace to graduate with a Regents diploma this month.

• Changes in NYS graduation requirements for Students with Disabilities recently approved will make it easier for them to earn a local diploma.

• Current reports on per pupil spending place us out of 459 out of 678 NYS schools with \$17,929 amount per student. The NYS average was \$20,610. We do rank higher than several local schools, as a result of cohort sizes that lead to reduced class sizes. With few exceptions, we are spending less than similar sized districts. Sackets Harbor is the only notable exception at \$14,909. They are much less reliant on NYS aid and have nearly twice the local tax levy.

• Another retiree has accepted our health insurance incentive. Two more are expected to before the end of the fiscal year. Total anticipated savings of all that signed up this year is \$733,000. School's outlay for retiree benefits has decreased over \$3,000 a month. Additionally, retirees are saving a total of approximately \$9,000 a year on their new plans.

• Our Audit by the State Comptroller's office has not been published as yet, but it has been referenced in other audits.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Superintendent Connell advised that Stanley Rowsam was the successful candidate to replace Dale Clarke in his cleaner position. Room changes will take place this summer due to the new BOCES 8:1:1 classroom. Mrs. Ratliff will relocate to the student support center. Mrs. Shambo will move there as well, serving as her secretary. UPK will be in one room with Mrs. Macaluso teaching pre-k in the a.m. and p.m. Mrs. Rarick will teach elementary art and AIS. The present learning center in room a59 is moving to room 160. We are not sure where Makerspace will be. The District has been awarded Bullet Aid in the amount of \$20,000 from Senator Griffo and \$5,000 from Senator Ritchie. The District's water has been tested for lead. Results are forthcoming. We did this on a voluntary basis. Soon it will be mandatory. The cost is aidable. We hope to use Community Schools money, which is not as restricted as initially thought, for an enhanced STARS program. Legislators have extended school's APPR approval date to December 31st. Administration and the CTA have come to an agreement. The CTA will vote on it shortly.
